

READING I

ISAIAH 42: 1-4, 6-7

The Baptism of the Lord

Lectionary: 21

Thus says the LORD:

here is my servant whom I uphold, my chosen one with whom I am pleased, upon whom I have put my spirit; he shall bring forth justice to the nations, not crying out, not shouting, not making his voice heard in the street. a bruised reed he shall not break, and a smoldering wick he shall not quench, until he establishes justice on the earth; the coastlands will wait for his teaching. I, the LORD, have called you for the victory of justice, I have grasped you by the hand; I formed you, and set you as a covenant of the people, a light for the nations, to open the eyes of the blind, to bring out prisoners from confinement, and from the dungeon, those who live in darkness.

is acceptable to him.


You know the word that he sent to the Israelites as he proclaimed peace through Jesus Christ, who is Lord of all,

Did you take down your Christmas tree and decorations yet? If so, why? Many people assume that Christmas ends on December 25—or perhaps when the calendar turns to January. But in the life of the Church, Christmas is not a day; it is a season; and that season doesn't really come to a close until the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, which this year falls on January 11.

In a world that rushes past Christmas too quickly, the Church invites us to linger, to reflect, and to be transformed. The Christmas season ends not with decorations coming down, but with a voice from heaven reminding us who Jesus is—and who we are in Him. And the Church gives us a decent amount of time to contemplate, to absorb, and to live the mystery of the Incarnation - God coming to earth and taking on human flesh to save us. We celebrate far more than a birth. We proclaim the bold truth that God has entered human history. Our religion is unlike any other!! The entire season unfolds in stages. We begin with the Nativity, marveling that the eternal Son of God is born in humility, with shepherds in attendance. Then we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family, showing us how God is at work in ordinary family life. Mary and Joseph have to flee with Jesus to Egypt in order to protect Him from the wrath of Herod. Joseph has to find new customers in order to continue his craft as a carpenter, earning enough to keep his family properly fed and clothed.

Next comes the Epiphany, the great feast of the entire season (ironically called "Little Christmas"), when Christ is revealed to the rest of the world, as represented through the visit of the Magi — pagans who are able to recognize the King and Savior. But the story does not end at the manger. The season reaches its fulfillment at the Baptism of the Lord. At the Jordan River, Jesus steps into the waters—not because He needs repentance, but to show that He chooses to stand with sinners. Then the heavens open, the Spirit descends, and the voice of the Father declares: "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased." This is why the Church sees the Baptism of the Lord as the true closing of Christmas. Here, Jesus is fully revealed—not just as the newborn child, but as the beloved Son of the Father, the One sent to redeem the world. Here, Christmas moves from infancy to mission.

So, Christmas is not just about what happened long ago; it is about what God continues to do now. Through our own baptism, we are joined to Christ as God's sons and daughters, and sent to live as witnesses in the world.

So when the Church closes the Christmas season this January 11, it's not ending the celebration—it is sending us forth. Just as Jesus leaves the Jordan and begins His public ministry, we are reminded that the light revealed at Christmas is meant to be carried into the ordinary days that follow. May the joy, humility, and light of Christmas remain alive in our hearts, shaping how we live as baptized followers of Christ.

"After Jesus was baptized, he came from the water and behold, the heavens were opened [for him], and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove [and] coming upon him. And a voice came from the heavens, saying, 'This is my beloved son, with whom I am well pleased' " (Mt 3:16-17).

In today's Gospel, we hear the story of Jesus' baptism by his cousin, John the Baptist. Do you remember your baptism? Maybe not! We know that Jesus did not need to be baptized because He is God, so why does He ask John to be baptized like you and me?

Even though you might not remember being baptized, there are two very important things that happened when you received that sacrament: 1) You were made a **son** or **daughter** of **God the Father**, and 2) you were cleansed from all sin. Just like at Jesus' baptism in the Gospel, you became God's "**beloved** son/daughter," with whom He is well pleased!

Even though Jesus was already God's Son, and was already free of sin, He was baptized as an **example** for us and to show us what happens when we are baptized. In your baptism, you joined the **family of God**, with a newly pure heart!

Jesus' baptism was the beginning of his mission in the world. Because of your baptism, you are equipped to live as Jesus did, **sharing the news of God's love** to your family, friends, and neighbors.

El Bautismo de Jesús

El Bautismo de Jesús en el río Jordán es un evento central en la vida de Cristo, narrado en los cuatro Evangelios. Marca el inicio de su ministerio público, la manifestación de la Santísima Trinidad y la santificación de las aguas bautismales para toda la humanidad. Celebrado en la fiesta del Bautismo del Señor (domingo después del 6 de enero), nos invita a renovar nuestra fe en el sacramento del Bautismo.

El Relato Bíblico

Los Evangelios sinópticos (Mateo 3,13-17; Marcos 1,9-11; Lucas 3,21-22) y Juan (1,29-34) describen el episodio con detalles complementarios:

Jesús se acerca a Juan Bautista: Aunque sin pecado, Jesús insiste en recibir el bautismo de penitencia de Juan en el Jordán, diciendo: "Déjalo ahora, porque así nos conviene cumplir toda justicia" (Mt 3,15). Esto muestra su humildad y solidaridad con los pecadores.

Manifestación de la Trinidad: Al salir del agua, se abren los cielos, el Espíritu Santo desciende como paloma sobre Jesús, y una voz del Padre declara: "Tú eres mi Hijo amado; en ti pongo mi complacencia" (Mc 1,11). Es la primera teofanía explícita de la Trinidad en el Nuevo Testamento.

Juan el Bautista testifica: "He visto al Espíritu que bajaba del cielo como una paloma y se posaba sobre él" (Jn 1,32), confirmando a Jesús como el Cordero de Dios.

Santificación de las aguas: Jesús, inmerso en el Jordán, hace de las aguas un instrumento de gracia. El Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica enseña que "Cristo tomó sobre sí el pecado del mundo y se hizo bautizado; el agua del Bautismo es signo de esta asunción del pecado". Así, nuestro Bautismo nos une a su muerte y resurrección (Rm 6,3-4).

Inicio del mesianismo: El Bautismo inaugura la misión de Jesús como Mesías sufriente, ungido por el Espíritu para predicar, sanar y redimir.

Modelo para los cristianos: Nos llama a una conversión continua, a vivir como hijos amados de Dios y a acoger el Espíritu Santo en nuestra vida diaria.

Celebración Litúrgica y Espiritual

En la liturgia, la fiesta del Bautismo del Señor cierra el tiempo de Navidad. La Iglesia bendice el agua y renueva las promesas bautismales, recordándonos nuestra identidad filial en Cristo.

Aplicación práctica:

Renueva tus promesas bautismales diariamente con una oración simple: "Señor Jesús, Hijo amado del Padre, bautízame de nuevo con tu Espíritu Santo".

Vive la humildad de Jesús: acoge el Espíritu en los sacramentos y en la oración.

En resumen, el Bautismo de Jesús revela el amor trinitario y nos incorpora a la vida divina. Que este misterio fortalezca tu fe y te impulse a ser testigo de Cristo en el mundo.





