

## READING I GENESIS 2: 7-9; 3: 1-7

The LORD God formed man out of the clay of the ground and blew into his nostrils the breath of life, and so man became a living being.

Then the LORD God planted a garden in Eden, in the east, and placed there the man whom he had formed. Out of the ground the LORD God made various trees grow that were delightful to look at and good for food, with the tree of life in the middle of the garden and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil.

Now the serpent was the most cunning of all the animals that the LORD God had made. The serpent asked the woman, "Did God really tell you not to eat from any of the trees in the garden?" The woman answered the serpent:

"We may eat of the fruit of the trees in the garden; it is only about the fruit of the tree in the middle of the garden that God said, 'You shall not eat it or even touch it, lest you die.'" But the serpent said to the woman: "You certainly will not die! No, God knows well that the moment you eat of it your eyes will be opened and you will be like gods who know what is good and what is evil."

The woman saw that the tree was good for food, pleasing to the eyes, and desirable for gaining wisdom. So she took some of its fruit and ate it; and she also gave some to her husband, who was with her, and he ate it. Then the eyes of both of them were opened, and they realized that they were naked; so they sewed fig leaves together and made loincloths for themselves.

## READING II ROMANS 5:12-19

Brothers and sisters:

Through one man sin entered the world, and through sin, death, and thus death came to all men, inasmuch as all sinned— for up to the time of the law, sin was in the world, though sin is not accounted when there is no law. But death reigned from Adam to Moses, even over those who did not sin after the pattern of the trespass of Adam, who is the type of the one who was to come. But the gift is not like the transgression. For if by the transgression of the one, the many died, how much more did the grace of God and the gracious gift of the one man Jesus Christ overflow for the many. And the gift is not like the result of the one who sinned. For after one sin there was the judgment that brought

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

condemnation; but the gift, after many transgressions, brought acquittal. For if, by the transgression of the one, death came to reign through that one, how much more will those who receive the abundance of grace and of the gift of justification come to reign in life through the one Jesus Christ. In conclusion, just as through one transgression condemnation came upon all, so, through one righteous act, acquittal and life came to all. For just as through the disobedience of the one man the many were made sinners, so, through the obedience of the one, the many will be made righteous.

## GOSPEL MATTHEW 5:17-37

At that time Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert to be tempted by the devil. He fasted for forty days and forty nights, and afterwards he was hungry.

The tempter approached and said to him, "If you are the Son of God, command that these stones become loaves of bread." He said in reply, "It is written: One does not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes forth from the mouth of God." Then the devil took him to the holy city, and made him stand on the parapet of the temple, and said to him, "If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down. For it is written: He will command his angels concerning you and with their hands they will support you, lest you dash your foot against a stone." Jesus answered him, "Again it is written, You shall not put the Lord, your God, to the test." Then the devil took him up to a very high mountain, and showed him all the kingdoms of the world in their magnificence, and he said to him, "All these I shall give to you, if you will prostrate yourself and worship me."

At this, Jesus said to him, "Get away, Satan! It is written: The Lord, your God, shall you worship and him alone shall you serve." Then the devil left him and, behold, angels came and ministered to him.

Msgr. Tom's Musings:  
Reflecting on Lent

Lent is one of the most grace-filled seasons of the Church's year. For Catholics, it's not simply a time of "giving something up" before the joy of Easter. Lent is a sacred pilgrimage—40 days—in which we walk with Christ thru the mystery of His Passion, Death and Resurrection. On Ash Wednesday, we hear the solemn words: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return," or "Repent, and believe in the Gospel." These powerful words set the tone of Lent, reminding us of two essential truths: our human frailty and God's boundless mercy.

Why 40 days? Scripture recalls that 40 is a number of preparation and purification: Israel wandered 40 years in the desert; Moses fasted 40 days on the mountain; and Jesus fasted for 40 days in the wilderness before beginning his public ministry. Lent, then, is our desert time. In a desert, distractions are stripped away. In our Lenten desert, we come face to face with who we are—and with who God is. The Church wisely calls us to three practices during Lent: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. By prayer, Lent asks us to deepen our relationship with God, not by simply saying more prayers, but to pray more intentionally: more frequent Mass, spending quiet time before the Blessed Sacrament, praying the Stations of the Cross, or slowly reading the Passion narratives in the Gospels. It's all about drawing close to Christ crucified, listening carefully to His voice, and letting his Word reach our hearts.

By fasting, we become countercultural. In a world that encourages constant consumption, fasting teaches us self-discipline and reminds us that we don't live by bread alone. When we fast—whether from food or unnecessary luxuries or from habits that distract us—we feel our hunger; and that hunger becomes a prayer that unites us with Christ in His suffering, and helps loosen the grip of attachments that can quietly rule our lives. Fasting is not about self-punishment; it is about freedom.

By almsgiving, we turn toward others in charity and away from sin and selfishness. It may mean financial generosity, but it also includes giving time and attention to those in need. If Lenten practices do not make us more compassionate and more attentive to the poor and suffering, then we've missed something essential.

Lent isn't an end in itself. At its heart, it's about conversion. The word "repent" in the Gospel means to change (one's mind and heart), to turn around, to examine our lives honestly. Where have I grown complacent? Where has sin taken root? Where is God inviting me to trust Him more deeply? This can be uncomfortable, but also hopeful. We're encouraged to receive the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation because we believe that no sin is greater than God's mercy, and that conversion isn't a one-time event but a lifelong journey.

Each year the Church gives us this time as a gift—a structured time to begin again. No matter how many Lents we have lived, each one is a new opportunity; God never tires of calling us back to his healing and restoration. If we rush to Easter without walking through Lent, the joy can feel thin. But if we have truly entered the desert—if we have allowed God to purify and renew us—then the proclamation "Christ is risen!" will resound with new depth and gratitude.






