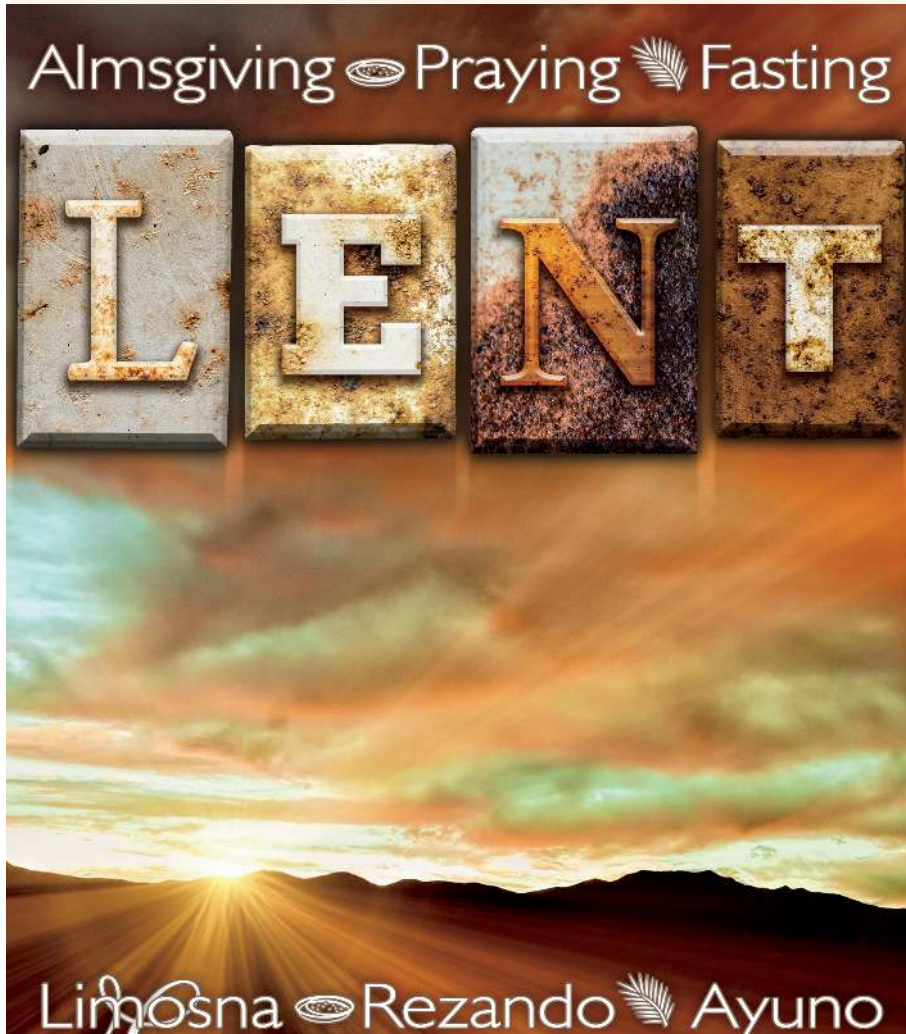



READING 1

1 Samuel 16:1b, 6-7,10-13a

The LORD said to Samuel:

“Fill your horn with oil, and be on your way. I am sending you to Jesse of Bethlehem, for I have chosen my king from among his sons.” As Jesse and his sons came to the sacrifice, Samuel looked at Eliab and thought, “Surely the LORD’s anointed is here before him.” But the LORD said to Samuel: “Do not judge from his appearance or from his lofty stature, because I have rejected him. Not as man sees does God see, because man sees the appearance but the LORD looks into the heart.” In the same way Jesse presented seven sons before Samuel, but Samuel said to Jesse, “The LORD has not chosen any one of these.” Then Samuel asked Jesse, “Are these all the sons you have?” Jesse replied, “There is still the youngest, who is tending the sheep.” Samuel said to Jesse, “Send for him; we will not begin the sacrificial banquet until he arrives here.” Jesse sent and had the young man brought to them. He was ruddy, a youth handsome to behold and making a splendid appearance. The LORD said, “There—anoint him, for this is the one!” Then Samuel, with the horn of oil in hand, anointed David in the presence of his brothers; and from that day on, the spirit of the LORD rushed upon David.

READING 2

Ephesians 5:8-14

Brothers and sisters:

You were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Live as children of light, for light produces every kind of goodness and righteousness and truth. Try to learn what is pleasing to the Lord. Take no part in the fruitless works of darkness; rather expose them, for it is shameful even to mention the things done by them in secret; but everything exposed by the light becomes visible, for everything that becomes visible is light. Therefore, it says: “Awake, O sleeper, and arise from the dead, and Christ will give you light.”

GOSPEL

John 9:1-41

As Jesus passed by he saw a man blind from birth. His disciples asked him, “Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?” Jesus answered, “Neither he nor his parents sinned; it is so that the works of God might be made visible through him. We have to do the works of the one who sent me while it is day. Night is coming when no one can work. While I am in the world, I am the light of the world.” When he had said this, he spat on the ground and made clay with the saliva, and smeared the clay on his eyes, and said to him, “Go wash in the Pool of Siloam” —which means Sent— So he went and washed, and came back able to see

and they said to him, “Where is he?” He said, “I don’t know.” They brought the one who was once blind to the Pharisees. Now Jesus had made clay and opened his eyes on a sabbath. So then the Pharisees also asked him how he was able to see. He said to them, “He put clay on my eyes, and I washed, and now I can see.” So some of the Pharisees said, “This man is not from God, because he does not keep the sabbath.” But others said, “How can a sinful man do such signs?” And there was a division among them. So they said to the blind man again, “What do you have to say about him, since he opened your eyes?” He said, “He is a prophet.” Now the Jews did not believe that he had been blind and gained his sight until they summoned the parents of the one who had gained his sight. They asked them, “Is this your son, who you say was born blind? How does he now see?” His parents answered and said, “We know that this is our son and that he was born blind. We do not know how he sees now, nor do we know who opened his eyes. Ask him, he is of age; he can speak for himself.” His parents said this because they were afraid of the Jews, for the Jews had already agreed that if anyone acknowledged him as the Christ, he would be expelled from the synagogue. For this reason his parents said, “He is of age; question him.” So a second time they called the man who had been blind and said to him, “Give God the praise! We know that this man is a sinner.” He replied, “If he is a sinner, I do not know. One thing I do know is that I was blind and now I see.” So they said to him, “What did he do to you? How did he open your eyes?” He answered them, “I told you already and you did not listen.

Why do you want to hear it again? Do you want to become his disciples, too?” They ridiculed him and said, “You are that man’s disciple; we are disciples of Moses! We know that God spoke to Moses, but we do not know where this one is from.” The man answered and said to them, “This is what is so amazing, that you do not know where he is from, yet he opened my eyes. We know that God does not listen to sinners, but if one is devout and does his will, he listens to him. It is unheard of that anyone ever opened the eyes of a person born blind. If this man were not from God, he would not be able to do anything.” They answered and said to him, “You were born totally in sin, and are you trying to teach us?” Then they threw him out. When Jesus heard that they had thrown him out, he found him and said, Do you believe in the Son of Man?” He answered and said, “Who is he, sir, that I may believe in him?” Jesus said to him, “You have seen him, the one speaking with you is he.” He said, “I do believe, Lord,” and he worshiped him. Then Jesus said, “I came into this world for judgment, so that those who do not see might see, and those who do see might become blind.” Some of the Pharisees who were with him heard this and said to him, “Surely we are not also blind, are we?” Jesus said to them, “If you were blind, you would have no sin; but now you are saying, ‘We see,’ so your sin remains.

Msgr. Tom's Musings:

THE FIGHT TO SAVE THE FAMILY

In his classic book, *The Decline and Fall of the Roman Empire*, Edward Gibbon cited the breakdown of the family and religion as major contributing factors to that decline. A permissive attitude towards sex saw the ruling class shun marriage; it was no longer regarded as a sacred obligation. People married for financial gain, if at all, and married men took mistresses. Soon the birth rate declined, and homosexuality, divorce, prostitution and abortion flourished. Does this sound vaguely familiar? And in the 20th century, it became evident that a growing US Communist Party had adopted this same anti-family agenda and had as one of its goals the discrediting of the family as an institution. The question is, have they achieved their goal?

Today, fewer young people are getting married, and those that do typically have few, if any, children. They find it easier to raise dogs and other animals rather than the God-given gift of children. Divorce laws have long been relaxed, the consequences of which are undeniable. Some parents are struggling to keep their family together after learning that one of their children has decided to "transition" to the other sex. As a result, loneliness, depression, and suicide rates are spiking, a reflection of the collapse of traditional family bonds. Long held prohibitions against obscenity have been weakened to the point where they no longer matter, and it is common place for left-wing politicians to stigmatize and falsely tag parents as "censors," when those courageous parents rightly object to obscene books being assigned to their children.

Parents who rally to eliminate these obscene books in classrooms and school libraries are on the upsurge, but many liberal politicians, lawmakers, and school boards are posing a strong resistance to their opposition. The breakdown of cultural standards of morality, by promoting pornography and obscenity in books, magazines, motion, pictures, TV, and now the internet, seems to show that the old communist goal has been realized.

Fortunately, there is one institution that has done more, and is continuing to combat these disturbing trends: it is the Catholic Church. It has stood against sexual misconduct and exploitation of women and children for nearly 20 centuries. Its support of marriage and the family is legendary, and it's promotion of a viable Christian moral standard stands in sharp contrast to the recklessness of the secularized culture that has engulfed our country, in particular, and the West, in general. But it is a long and difficult battle that is constantly being waged.

Every pope in modern times has spoken forcefully about the key role that the family plays in the making of a good society, especially Pope St. Paul VI and Pope St. John Paul II, who warn that the family was under attack by both civil society and the state. They said that the decline in respect for moral absolutes and the rise of "moral relativism" is a type of "soft totalitarianism" that has been gradually and perversely overcoming the West. The late Pope Benedict XVI was also alarmed about this phenomenon. He said, "the family is an intermediate institution between individuals and society, and nothing can completely take its place." He also stressed the importance of recognizing the "complementary characteristics" of men and women. Both possess equal dignity; but it is their different, yet supportive attributes that brought about "a community of love and life." Obviously, these great men are true shepherds who obligingly dare to stand against the prevailing tide.

If only our society could heed their words! Tragically, it seems to devalue marriage and the family, and accepts the secular state edicts on these institutions as if they were the word of God. Sadly, it celebrates "moral relativism," and pretends that men and women are essentially unisex, in form and practice. This is crazy! No wonder, families are falling apart; and the biggest victims of this are the children!
