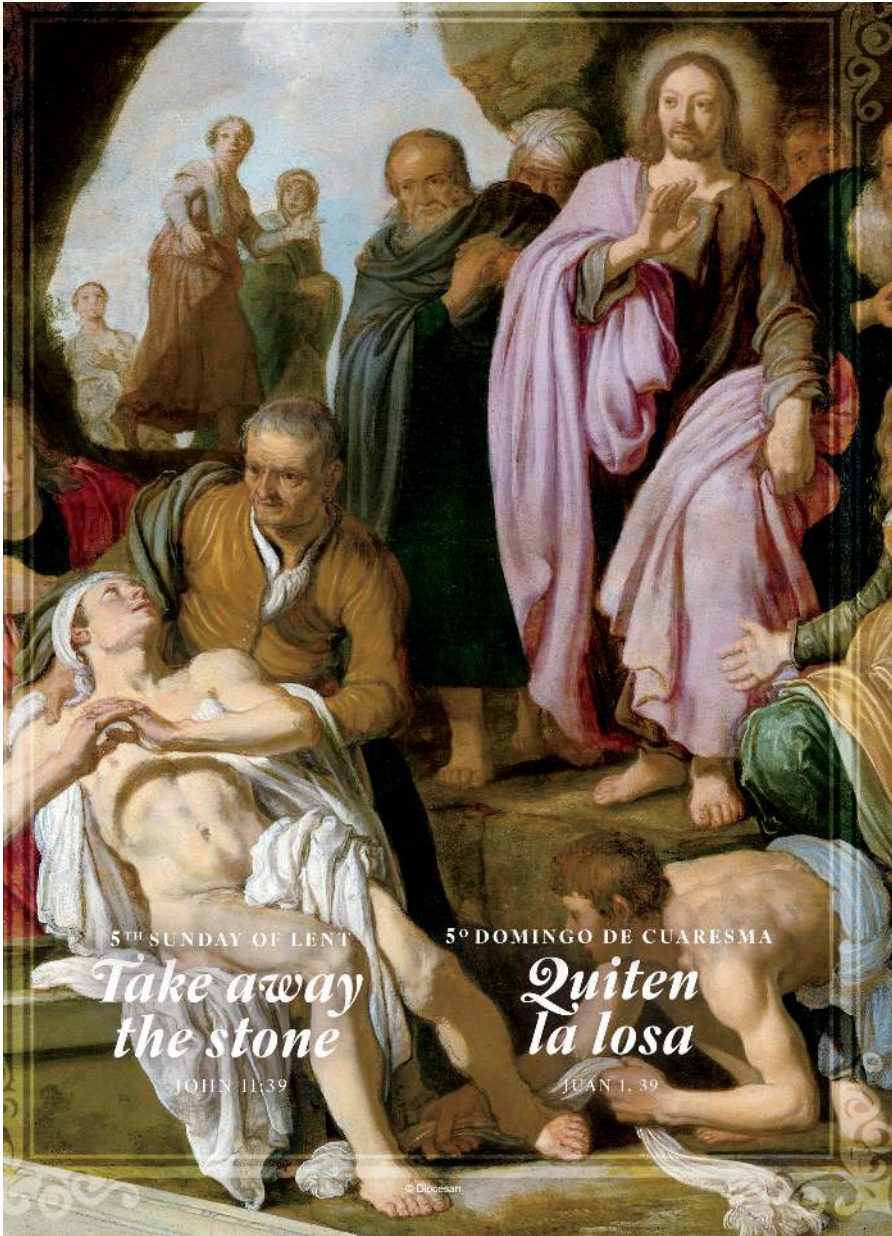

“Master, the one you love is ill.”
When Jesus heard this he said,
“This illness is not to end in death,
but is for the glory of God,
that the Son of God may be glorified
through it.” Now Jesus loved Martha and her
sister and Lazarus.
So when he heard that he was ill,
he remained for two days in the place
where he was.
Then after this he said to his disciples,
“Let us go back to Judea.”
The disciples said to him,
“Rabbi, the Jews were just trying to stone you,
and you want to go back there?”
Jesus answered,
“Are there not twelve hours in a day?
If one walks during the day, he does not stumble,
because he sees the light of this world.
But if one walks at night, he stumbles,
because the light is not in him.”
He said this, and then told them,

“Our friend Lazarus is asleep, but I am going to awaken
him.” So the disciples said to him, “Master, if he is
asleep, he will be saved.”

But Jesus was talking about his death,
while they thought that he meant ordinary sleep. So
then Jesus said to them clearly, “Lazarus has died. And I
am glad for you that I was not there, that you may
believe.

Let us go to him.” So Thomas, called Didymus, said to his
fellow disciples, “Let us also go to die with him.”

When Jesus arrived, he found that Lazarus
had already been in the tomb for four days.

Now Bethany was near Jerusalem, only about two miles
away. And many of the Jews had come to Martha and
Mary

to comfort them about their brother. When Martha
heard that Jesus was coming, she went to meet him; but
Mary sat at home. Martha said to Jesus, “Lord, if you had
been here, my brother would not have died.

But even now I know that whatever you ask of God,
God will give you.” Jesus said to her, “Your brother will
rise.” Martha said to him, “I know he will rise, in the
resurrection on the last day.” Jesus told her,

“I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in
me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and
believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?”

She said to him, “Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that
you are the Christ, the Son of God, the one who is
coming into the world.” When she had said this,
she went and called her sister Mary secretly, saying,
“The teacher is here and is asking for you.”

As soon as she heard this, she rose quickly and went to
him. For Jesus had not yet come into the village,
but was still where Martha had met him.

So when the Jews who were with her in the house
comforting her saw Mary get up quickly and go out,
they followed her, presuming that she was going to the
tomb to weep there. When Mary came to where Jesus
was and saw him, she fell at his feet and said to him,

“Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have
died.” When Jesus saw her weeping and the Jews who
had come with her weeping, he became perturbed and
deeply troubled, and said, “Where have you laid him?”

They said to him, “Sir, come and see.” And Jesus wept. So
the Jews said, “See how he loved him.” But some of them
said,

“Could not the one who opened the eyes of the blind
man

have done something so that this man would not have
died?” So Jesus, perturbed again, came to the tomb.

It was a cave, and a stone lay across it. Jesus said, “Take
away the stone.” Martha, the dead man’s sister, said to
him, “Lord, by now there will be a stench; he has been
dead for four days.” Jesus said to her, “Did I not tell you
that if you believe you will see the glory of God?”

So they took away the stone. And Jesus raised his eyes
and said, “Father, I thank you for hearing me. I know that
you always hear me; but because of the crowd here I
have said this, that they may believe that you sent me.”

And when he had said this, He cried out in a loud voice,
“Lazarus, come out!” The dead man came out, tied hand
and foot with burial bands, and his face was wrapped in
a cloth. So Jesus said to them, “Untie him and let him go.”
Now many of the Jews who had come to Mary
and seen what he had done began to believe in him

Msgr. Tom's Musings: Is Homeschooling OK for Catholics?

The Catholic Church has always given a priority to parents in making decisions regarding the education of their children. The new Catechism of the Catholic Church has stated unequivocally that "Parents have the first responsibility for the education of their children." The Second Vatican Council, in its document on Christian Education, stated, "Since parents have given children their life, they are bound by the most serious obligation to educate their offspring, and therefore must be recognized as the primary and principal educators." So, the Catholic Church seems to find that proper homeschooling is entirely acceptable, and even offers various services to facilitate many such programs. These may vary from diocese to diocese, especially where such resources may be more scarce.

I was blessed to have a parochial school at my fourth and final assignment as pastor of St. Vincent Ferrer Parish in Delray Beach. In my prior assignments as a pastor, I was never able to be blessed with having a parish school on campus. It is in one of those assignments that I first became familiar with the process of homeschooling. Numerous Catholic parents wanted to send their children to Catholic schools, but we're unable to find one reasonably close to their home. So many of them had a vibrant program of homeschooling, and often joined forces to share resources with one another. I was impressed with the fruits or results of such programs, as they yielded wonderful and active Catholics, who gave impetus to their offspring to continue the program into the next generation.

Critics of the homeschooling process often say that the children in these programs are deprived of the social interaction and integration which can be found in private or public schooling programs. But, that can easily be overcome when such parents join forces with one another and work hand-in-hand with their parishes, and network with those pro-Christian clubs and organizations that provide meaningful social outlets for their children.

Homeschooling is legal throughout the United States, though for most of the last century it ran afoul of compulsory education laws. It is clearly on the rise and now is found to be "the fastest growing form of education in our country." Critics are worried that these children are slipping away from the control systems manufactured by the educational elites who want to "force feed" some of the nonsense that has been seen in our public school districts in the more liberal settings of our nation. Thank God, so far, for those areas where Catholic schools flourish; and in those regions where they can't do so anymore because of demographics, wise parents can still promote Christian foundations in their homeschooling education programs. For those who worry that this school choice initiative is essentially "unregulated," one need only to consider that the sexual abuse of minors in public schools is a far greater and more serious problem and threat to our children than in other forms of education in our country, despite so-called "government oversight." In these schools, sadly, not only are unspeakably high rates of abuse tolerated, but they have resisted, via their unions, the establishment of a nationwide data base. It is this which allows offending teachers to be moved from one school district to another in what has been called "passing the trash," thereby ensuring even further abuse.

One more note: homeschooling parents and reliable Catholic schools do not have to deal with "trans" situations in their sports programs. Based on solid Christian (and, in some cases, Jewish) moral principles, proper God-given roles for men and women are respected and promoted, deriving their perspective from biblically-inspired teachings.

May God bless these wise and prudent parents, knowing that their children are gifts from a loving and principled God. (When time will permit in the future, I hope to be able to expand further on these matters.)

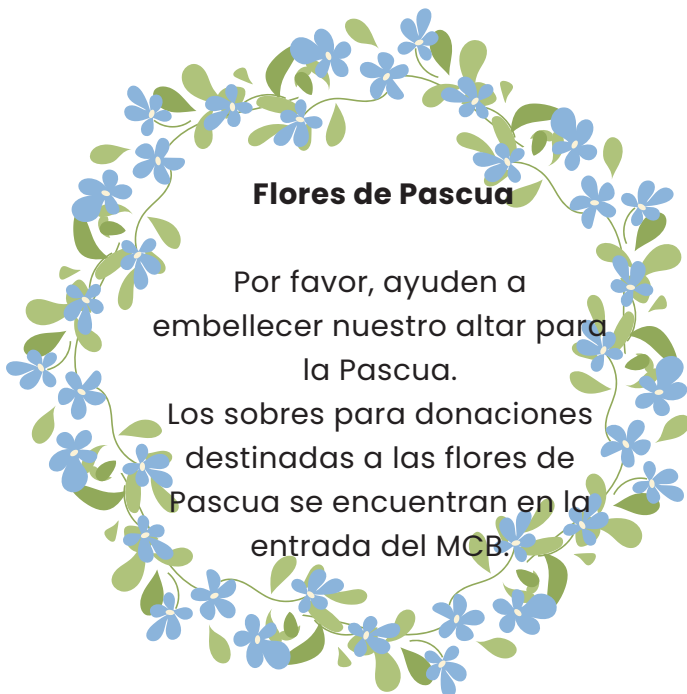

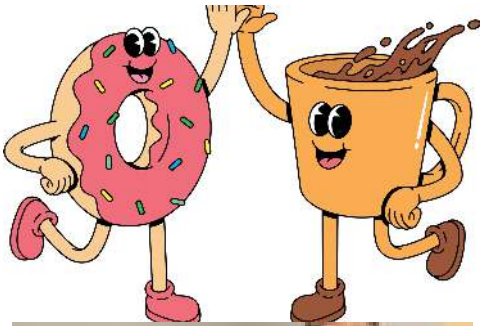

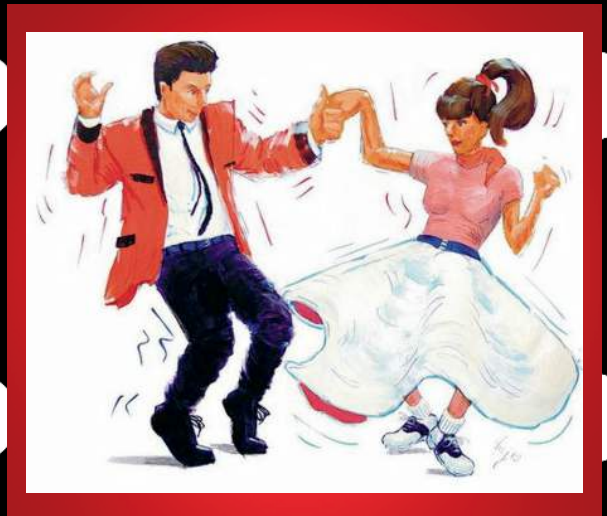
