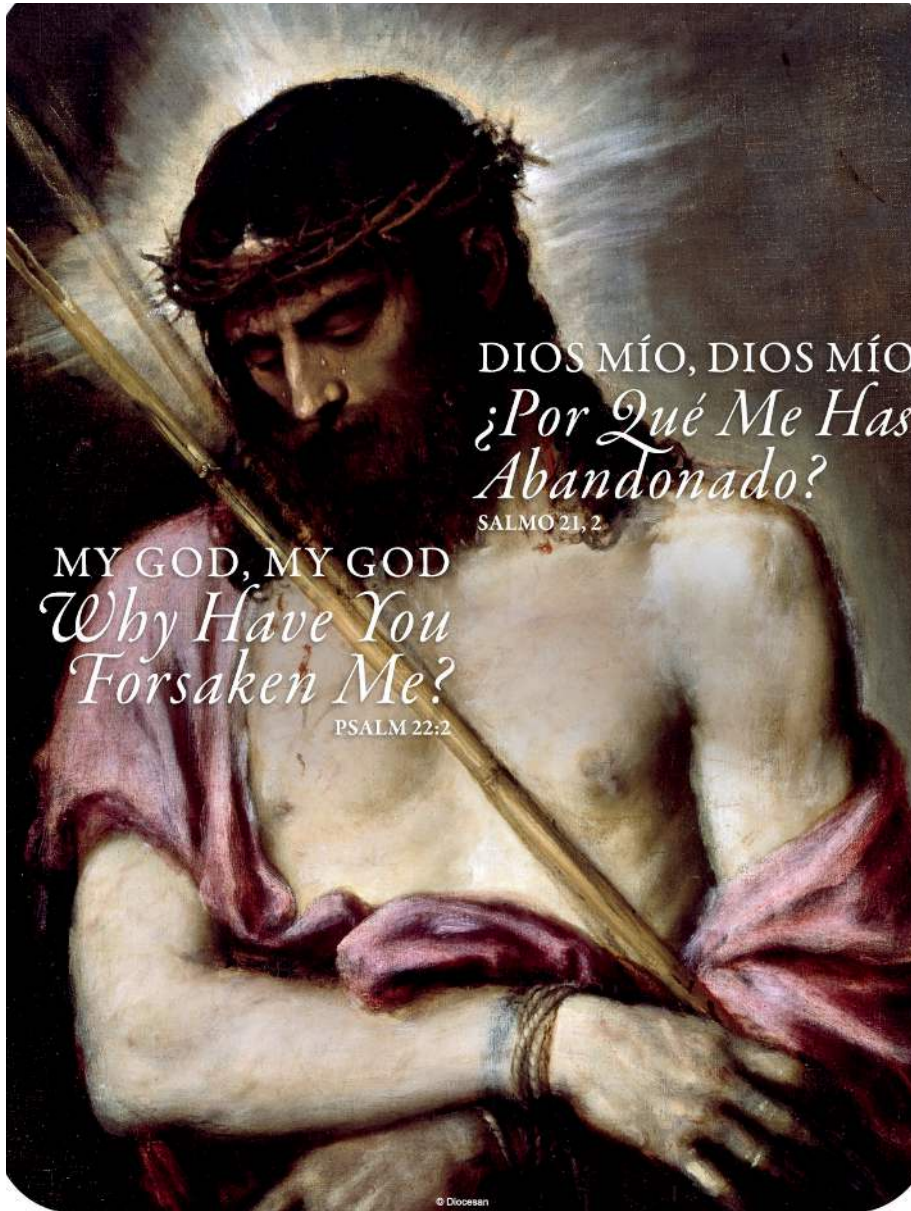

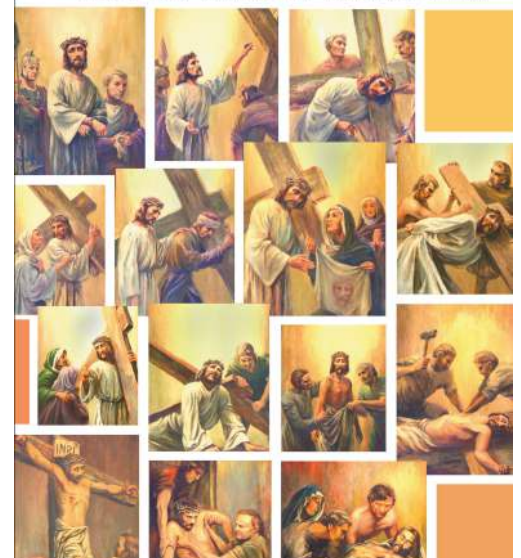

Msgr. Tom's Musings: THE BEAUTY OF THE WEEK WE CALL "HOLY"

Holy Week is the most sacred time of the Christian year—a time that invites us not just to remember, but to deeply reflect on the mystery of Christ's love. A lot of people mistakenly refer to this week as Easter Week. No, that really begins on Easter Sunday and runs through the following weekend, culminating with the great Easter feast of Divine Mercy Sunday. Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday, where we walk with Jesus into Jerusalem. The cheering crowds welcomed Him with palms and shouts of "Hosanna!", yet we know how quickly those same voices turned on Him by Friday. So, Holy Week invites us to reflect honestly: Is my faith steady, or does it waver when following Christ becomes difficult? As the week unfolds, we move into Holy Thursday, where Jesus gives us the twofold gift of the Eucharist and the Priesthood (Holy Orders) as examples of humble service. A well-received option of washing the feet of several representatives ties in with the biblical ritual of the washing of the feet of the disciples. Here love is expressed not in words alone, but in self-giving action. We are reminded that to follow Christ means to serve—to bow in humble service before others, especially in their need.

Then comes Good Friday, the day of the Cross. It is a solemn and sobering moment. We recall the few faithful who stood at Calvary and witnessed the suffering, betrayal, and death of our Lord and Savior. Yet this is not meaningless suffering—it is sacrificial love. The dreaded Cross reveals the depth of God's mercy, a love willing to endure everything to its finality in order to redeem us. On this day, we are invited not to look away from suffering, but to see in it the presence of a God who saves. It is a somber day, marked by fasting and abstinence.

Holy Week reaches its fulfillment in Easter, marking the triumph of life over death. It begins with the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday evening, when new members are welcomed into the fullness of the Catholic Faith. It is the "feast of light", marking the beginning of the celebration of Christ's Resurrection'. For me, it's the most beautiful ritual in the Church's liturgical year. With the singing of the great "ALLELUIA!" the silence of the tomb is broken and hope is restored. The Resurrection tells us that no darkness is final, no sin is beyond forgiveness, no grave is the end of the story. But Holy Week should be for us more than a sequence of events—it is a path we are called to walk personally. It asks us to enter into humility on Palm Sunday, to serve with love on Holy Thursday, to trust in the midst of suffering on Good Friday, and to rejoice in new life at Easter. It challenges us to let go of our superficial faith and to embrace a deeper discipleship—one that follows Christ not only in moments of glory, but also through sacrifice and surrender. Perhaps most importantly, Holy Week reminds us that God's love is not abstract. It is lived out—in betrayal and forgiveness, in suffering and redemption, in death and resurrection.

As we journey through these sacred days, let's not remain just spectators. Instead, let's place ourselves within the story. Let's bring our own burdens, our own sins, our own hopes—and allow Christ to transform them. For in the end, Holy Week isn't only about what happened to Jesus; it's about what can happen within us as we die to sin and rise to new life, embracing a deeper union with the One who gave his ALL for us! Enjoy a beautiful Holy Week!

Who can be a Godparent?

- **Must be a fully initiated Catholic (baptized, confirmed, and has received the Eucharist)**
- **At least 16 years old**
- **Practicing the faith and living in harmony with Church teachings**
- **Cannot be the child's parent**



Being a godparent is a **spiritual role**, not just a social one. The concept of godparents comes from the early Church, when adult converts were baptized and needed faithful Christians to help **guide** and **support** them in their new life with Christ. These sponsors were **witnesses** to the faith and stood beside the newly baptized as **spiritual mentors**. Today, especially in the case of infant baptism, the Church continues this tradition by inviting godparents to help nurture the child's faith as they grow. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church:

"Godparents... must be firm believers, able and ready to help the newly baptized — child or adult — on the road of Christian life." (CCC 1255)

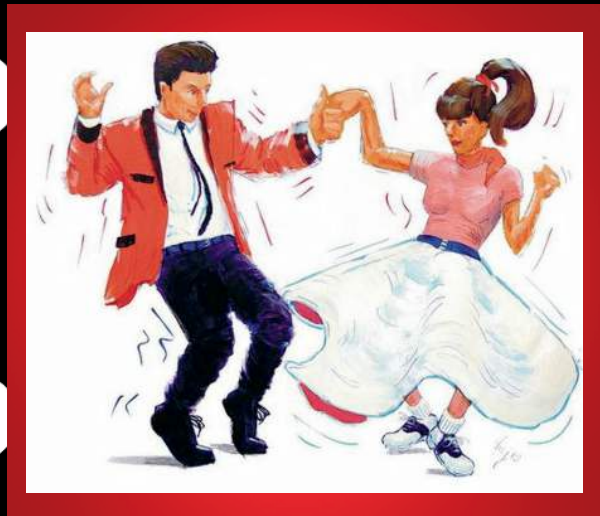
