

The Samaritan woman said to him,


"How can you, a Jew, ask me, a Samaritan woman, for a drink?"

Msgr. Tom's Musings:
THE "FIGHTING IRISH" Part 2

Well, the battle at Notre Dame that I mentioned last week is mostly won. The intense protests by loyal Catholic students, alumni and friends, including the local Catholic Bishop and at least 20 of his 'bishop colleagues', have forced Susan Osterman to decline her nomination as the Dean of the School of Asian and Asiatic Studies. The victory came about when the students sought to pray at the famous campus grotto of Lourdes. Intense, devout, trusting prayer always produces good results!

Notre Dame is not only one of America's best institutions of higher education, it is also seen, for the most part, as an authentically Catholic institution. That's why it was so weird and also scary that Prof. Ostermann had nearly become the Dean of the institute. She is not someone who happens to be "pro-choice"—she is actually a pro-abortion zealot. Any person who falsely claims that the pro-life movement has "its roots in white supremacy and racism," and condemns crisis pregnancy centers as "anti-abortion propaganda sites," might better place himself at Planned Parenthood, not Notre Dame. Planned Parenthood, of course, was founded by a bona fide white supremacist, Margaret Sanger. Ostermann's "near miss" appointment wasn't a mistake. She got it with approval of ND president Fr. Robert Dodd, the university provost and the dean of the Keough School of Global Affairs. The school president claims he was "blindsided". Didn't he know that his predecessor publicly rebuked Ostermann for championing the pro-abortion cause? Surely the other two officials must have known. Ultimately, she will go back to the classroom. So it ended fairly well. But I believe she should have been "canned" altogether because of the damage she can still do in a classroom.

Notre Dame is not unique among Catholic schools. Many administrators and faculty at other schools that call themselves 'Catholic,' are often indifferent and sometimes even hostile towards the teachings of the Catholic Church. Take, for instance, Georgetown, the first Catholic institution of higher learning in our country. It has two pro-abortion student clubs on campus. Moreover, student government officials have sought to punish students who accept the Church's teachings on marriage. It also employs a professor who justifies rape and slavery, provided the rapists and slavemasters are Muslim. Thankfully, Notre Dame is not like Georgetown.

But a real problem still exists on many of these campuses and there are two main reasons: one is ideological and the other is a matter of identity. The first one boils down to a constant struggle of liberal vs. conservative Catholics in the Church, and therefore on our Catholic campuses. The other greater problem, identity, occurs when many Catholic professors and administrators are uneasy being identified as Catholic in higher education circles. They need to have the affirmation of their secular elite counterparts. Regrettably, this leads many to hide their Catholicism. They are not comfortable in their Catholic skin. They know how their peers at universities, such as Duke, Northwestern, Vanderbilt, Harvard, etc., ("the club") look at Catholics, and they're scared to death of being on the outside of the educational spectrum. In other words, their reluctance to be associated with traditional Catholic settings and the Church's traditional moral teachings—even when they don't disagree with them—is because they want to win the blessings of secular elites, in and out of education.

These "Catholic" institutions of higher learning will be challenged again and again; and most of it will come from within. But as long as they have enough faculty, students and alumni who are vigilant, they can secure their reputation as a truly great Catholic institutions of higher learning. And the beat goes on.....
