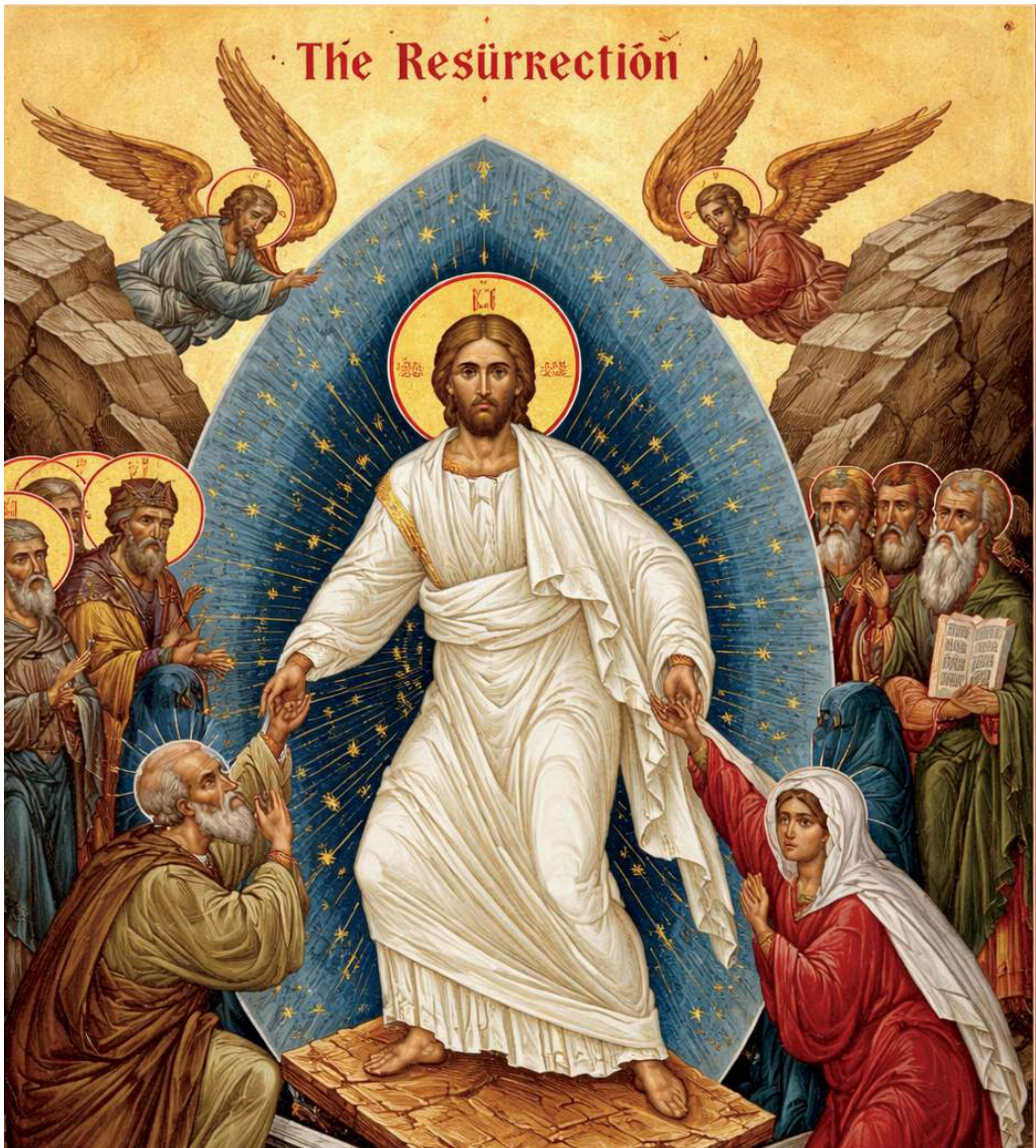

¿Quiénes resucitarán?

Catecismo 998 «¿Quién resucitará? Todos los hombres que han muerto:» los que hayan hecho el bien resucitarán para la vida, y los que hayan hecho el mal, para la condenación” (Jn 5, 29; cf. Dn 12, 2).

Daniel 12,1-3 «En aquel tiempo surgirá Miguel, el gran Príncipe que defiende a los hijos de tu pueblo. Será aquél un tiempo de angustia como no habrá habido hasta entonces otro desde que existen las naciones. En aquel tiempo se salvará tu pueblo: todos los que se encuentren inscritos en el Libro. Muchos de los que duermen en el polvo de la tierra se despertarán, unos para la vida eterna, otros para el oprobio, para el horror eterno. Los doctos brillarán como el fulgor del firmamento, y los que enseñaron a la multitud la justicia, como las estrellas, por toda la eternidad.

Juan 5,29 y saldrán los que hayan hecho el bien para una resurrección de vida, y los que hayan hecho el mal, para una resurrección de juicio.

Catecismo 1015 “Caro salutis est caro” (“La carne es soporte de la salvación”) (Tertuliano, res., 8, 2). Creemos en Dios que es el creador de la carne; creemos en el Verbo hecho carne para rescatar la carne; creemos en la resurrección de la carne, perfección de la creación y de la redención de la carne.

Catecismo 1016 Por la muerte, el alma se separa del cuerpo, pero en la resurrección Dios devolverá la vida incorruptible a nuestro cuerpo transformado reuniéndolo con nuestra alma. Así como Cristo ha resucitado y vive para siempre, todos nosotros resucitaremos en el último día.

Catecismo 1017 “Creemos en la verdadera resurrección de esta carne que poseemos ahora” (DS 854). No obstante, se siembra en el sepulcro un cuerpo corruptible, resucita un cuerpo incorruptible (Corintios 15:42), un “cuerpo espiritual” (1 Corintios 15:44).

Catecismo 1018 Como consecuencia del pecado original, el hombre debe sufrir “la muerte corporal, de la que el hombre se habría liberado, si no hubiera pecado” (GS 18).

Catecismo 1019 Jesús, el Hijo de Dios, sufrió libremente la muerte por nosotros en una sumisión total y libre a la voluntad de Dios, su Padre. Por su muerte venció a la muerte, abriendo así a todos los hombres la posibilidad de la salvación.



Monsignor Tom's Musings: WHICH IS GREATER, EASTER OR DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY?

One of my amazing discoveries is that I've found too many people who call themselves Catholics confuse Holy Week with Easter Week. What may bring about this confusion is often caused by commentary from the secular news media or the non-Christian schools about a "Spring Break," which often occurs just before Easter. But Easter Week really begins on Easter Sunday, and during that week, the Church invites us not just to celebrate a past event but to live out our lives in a new way. You see, the Resurrection of Jesus from the dead is not simply an event of the past that we annually commemorate—some one-time event that happened and we continue to celebrate. It's something that is still happening; Jesus is alive and is actively seeking us. That's why the Church celebrates the whole week as if it were one day, each day being equally important as Sunday.

In the Gospel accounts throughout this week, we notice that, even though his disciples were following Jesus for 3 years and witnessed his many miracles, they don't immediately recognize Him. For instance, Mary of Magdala mistakes Him for the gardener; and two disciples on the road to Emmaus walk with Him for a long time without recognizing Him. Even the Apostles, who gathered secretly in the Upper Room out of fear, struggle to believe. Why? Because the Resurrection did not allow a return to their former way of life—it's the beginning of something entirely new. Jesus is the same; yet somehow He's transformed. With this feast, the same should be true for us.

When the risen Christ appears to the apostles, His first words are not words of judgment, but of peace: "Peace be with you." He shows them His wounds—not to condemn them for abandoning Him, but to reassure them that His love is stronger than their failure. Then He gives them a mission: to forgive sins and to show his mercy to others. That's why Easter is not only about Jesus rising from the dead; it's about our being raised with Him. It means our fear doesn't have the last word; our sin doesn't have the last word; even death itself doesn't have the last word. Yet, just like the disciples, we often struggle to recognize Him in our lives. We look for God in dramatic moments; but He comes quietly—through Scripture, through the sacraments, through acts of charity, through moments of unexpected peace. As we move through Easter Week, day after day, the Church wisely focuses our attention on one central truth: the mercy of God. This is the heart of the Easter message. God's mercy is not abstract—it is personal. It meets us exactly where we are, in our weakness, in our doubts, in our sins. When we conclude the week on the following Sunday, we rise to the pinnacle of our Easter Day celebration—eight days rolled up into one—the Feast of Feasts—Divine Mercy Sunday.

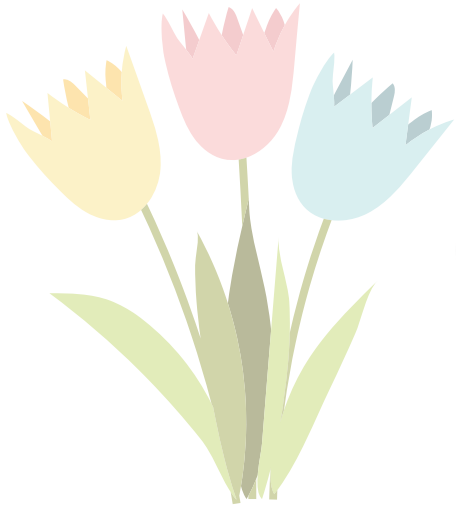
Divine Mercy Sunday is not just about trusting that God can forgive sins in general—it's about trusting that He can forgive our sins; that His mercy is greater than our past; that His love is stronger than our failures. So, when the risen Christ appears to the Apostles, His first words are not words of judgment, but of peace: "Peace be with you." He shows them His wounds—not to condemn them for abandoning Him, but to reassure them that His love is stronger than their failure. Then He gives them a mission: to forgive sins, showing his mercy to others. So, as we celebrate the full beauty of Easter Week, and approach Divine Mercy Sunday, we are invited to do two simple but powerful things: to trust, and to receive: To trust that God's mercy is real, and to receive it, especially in the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation. Then, just as importantly, we can become instruments of that mercy for others.

Our embattled world doesn't need more judgment; it needs witnesses to the Resurrection: people who live as if mercy is real; people who forgive, who show compassion, who bring hope. Easter Sunday reminds us: Christ is risen.

Divine Mercy Sunday reminds us:
His mercy is still flowing;
AND THAT MERCY IS FOR YOU AND ME!

- On this Easter Day, we celebrate the empty tomb and Jesus's resurrection but think also of our brothers and sisters in need, who may not eat today. We lift them up as we pray in Jesus's name. Amen.
- God, who is the source of all the good in our lives, we ask You to bless us. We gather at this table as family and friends, united in love of You. We are filled with gratitude for the gift of this meal and the many gifts you've given us. May we carry with us tomorrow the joy that we feel today, sharing Your love and building Your kingdom here on earth. Amen.
- After Jesus was resurrected, he commissioned his disciples and reminded them that he was with them always. Jesus calls us, as well. And He's here with us now, too. May this meal give us strength and courage to follow God's call in our own lives. Amen.
- Heavenly Creator, we lift up these gifts to You, grateful for the gift of life. We give thanks for this meal as we pray for peace in our world and the renewal of society. Amen.
- Bless us, O Lord, and these Thy gifts, which we are about to receive, from Thy bounty, through Christ, our Lord.

Who can be a Godparent?

- **Must be a fully initiated Catholic (baptized, confirmed, and has received the Eucharist)**
- **At least 16 years old**
- **Practicing the faith and living in harmony with Church teachings**
- **Cannot be the child's parent**



Being a godparent is a **spiritual role**, not just a social one. The concept of godparents comes from the early Church, when adult converts were baptized and needed faithful Christians to help **guide** and **support** them in their new life with Christ. These sponsors were **witnesses** to the faith and stood beside the newly baptized as **spiritual mentors**. Today, especially in the case of infant baptism, the Church continues this tradition by inviting godparents to help nurture the child's faith as they grow. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church:

"Godparents... must be firm believers, able and ready to help the newly baptized — child or adult — on the road of Christian life." (CCC 1255)
