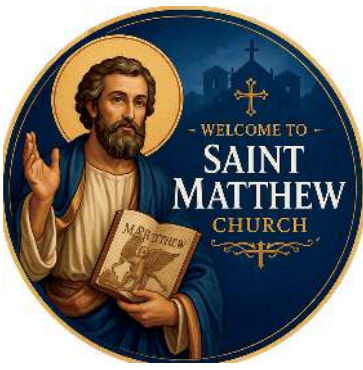

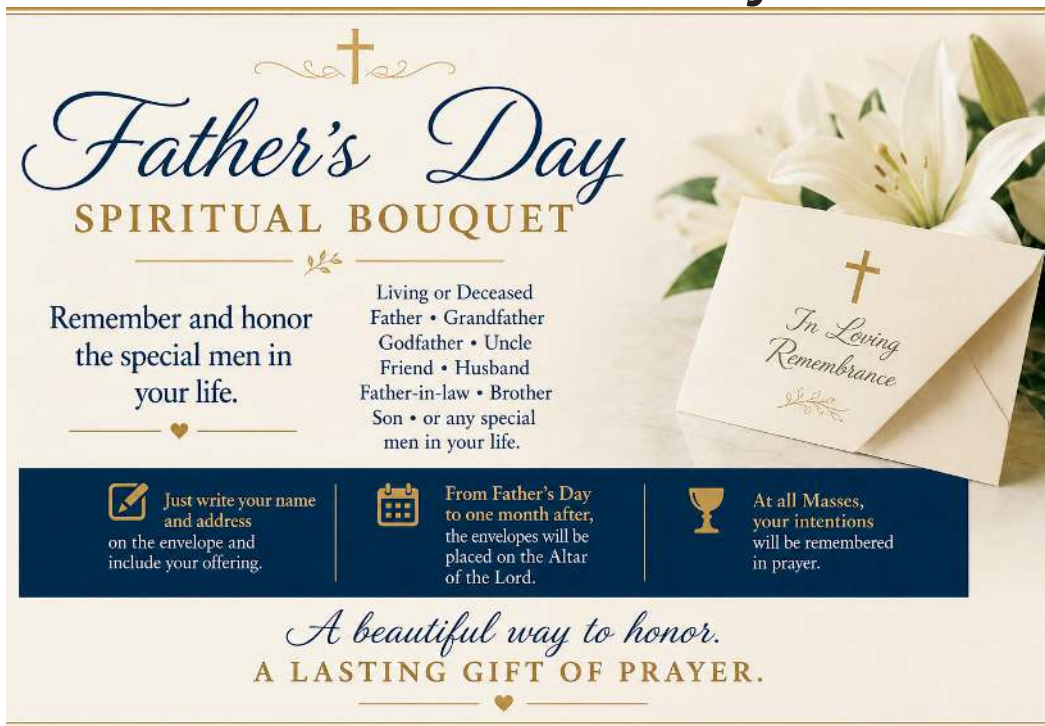

SAINT ROMUALD, ABBOT
FEAST DAY: JUNE 19

Saint Romuald (c. 951–1027) was an Italian monk, abbot, and founder of the Camaldolese Order, a branch of the Benedictine family. Born into a noble family in Ravenna, Italy, he experienced a profound conversion and chose to dedicate his life completely to God through prayer, penance, and service.

Known for his deep spirituality, Saint Romuald worked to reform monasteries and encourage a more faithful and disciplined religious life. He combined the traditions of monastic community living with the solitude of the hermit's life, emphasizing prayer, silence, and contemplation.

Saint Romuald's devotion to God and commitment to spiritual renewal continue to inspire Christians today. He is remembered as a model of holiness, humility, and perseverance in seeking God's will.

Patron Saint of: The Camaldolese Order and those seeking a contemplative life.

Prayerful Reflection:

"Sit in your cell as in paradise; put the whole world behind you and forget it." — Saint Romuald.

In those days, the Israelites came to the desert of Sinai and pitched camp.

While Israel was encamped here in front of the mountain, Moses went up the mountain to God. Then the LORD called to him and said, "Thus shall you say to the house of Jacob; tell the Israelites: You have seen for yourselves how I treated the Egyptians and how I bore you up on eagle wings and brought you here to myself. Therefore, if you hearken to my voice and keep my covenant, you shall be my special possession, dearer to me than all other people, though all the earth is mine. You shall be to me a kingdom of priests, a holy nation."

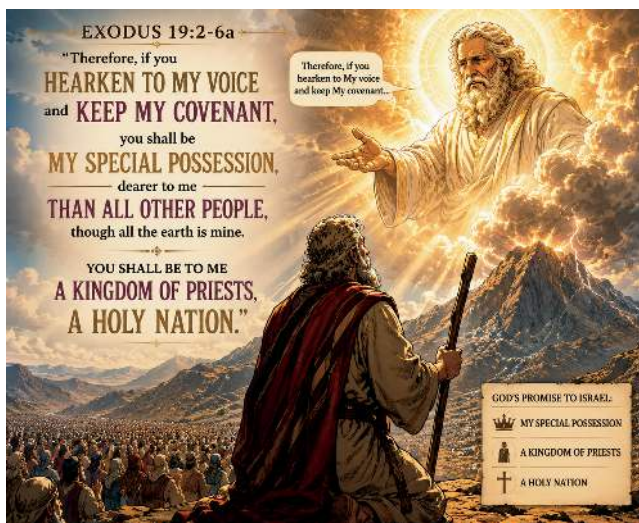
Reading 2

Romans 5:6-11

Brothers and sisters:

Christ, while we were still helpless, yet died at the appointed time for the ungodly. Indeed, only with difficulty does one die for a just person, though perhaps for a good person one might even find courage to die.

But God proves his love for us in that while we were still sinners Christ died for us. How much more then, since we are now justified by his blood, will we be saved through him from the wrath. Indeed, if, while we were enemies, we were reconciled to God through the death of his Son, how much more, once reconciled, will we be saved by his life. Not only that, but we also boast of God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation.

Matthew 9:36—10:8

At the sight of the crowds, Jesus' heart was moved with pity for them because they were troubled and abandoned, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest."

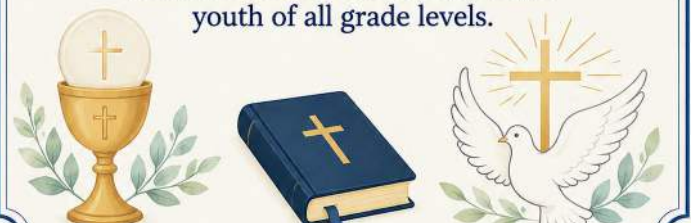
Then he summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits to drive them out and to cure every disease and every illness. The names of the twelve apostles are these: first, Simon called Peter, and his brother Andrew; James, the son of Zebedee, and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew, Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James, the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddeus; Simon from Cana, and Judas Iscariot who betrayed him. Jesus sent out these twelve after instructing them thus, "Do not go into pagan territory or enter a Samaritan town. Go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. As you go, make this proclamation: 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand.' Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, drive out demons.

Without cost you have received; without cost you are to give."

WHAT IS THIS CAMPAIGN FOR?

This campaign will help St. Matthew Catholic Church retire the remaining parish debt and strengthen the future of our parish for worship, ministry, formation, outreach, and growth.

HOW CAN I MAKE MY GIFT?

You may support the campaign through a one-time gift, a pledge over time, online giving, an IRA gift, or a gift through your will or estate plan.

CAN I GIVE FROM MY IRA?

Yes. If you are age 70½ or older, you may be able to make a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) directly from your IRA to St. Matthew Catholic Church. A QCD can satisfy all or part of your required minimum distribution. 2026 QCD annual limit: up to **\$111,000**.

IS THERE A TAX BENEFIT IF I DO NOT ITEMIZE?

Beginning in tax year 2026, taxpayers who do not itemize may still be able to deduct up to **\$1,000** in cash charitable gifts, or up to **\$2,000** if married filing jointly, subject to IRS rules and limitations.

Yes. Including St. Matthew Catholic Church in your will or estate plan is a meaningful way to leave a legacy of faith for the parish you love.



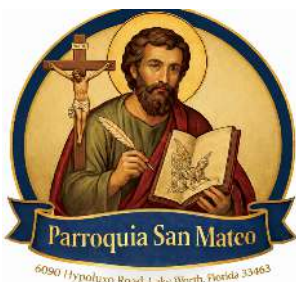

Celebrating the Flag and the Faith of our Fathers

Flag Day, celebrated on June 14th each year, invites us to reflect on the meaning of our nation's flag and the ideals it represents. While the flag itself is made of cloth and thread, what it symbolizes is far greater: the history, sacrifices, hopes, and unity of the American people. It commemorates June 14, 1777, when the Continental Congress adopted the Stars and Stripes as the official flag of the United States. Since that day, generations of Americans have looked upon this flag as a sign of freedom, courage, and national identity. The stars on the flag represent our states united together. The stripes recall the original colonies that began this great experiment in self-government. Together, they symbolize a people who may differ in background, experiences, and beliefs, yet are joined in a common commitment to the principles upon which this nation was founded. One of the blessings of celebrating Flag Day is that it reminds us of God's gifts that we often take for granted. We enjoy freedoms that many people throughout history and around the world have only dreamed of: freedom of speech, freedom of religion, freedom to vote, and freedom to pursue our hopes and aspirations. The flag serves as a visible reminder of these precious liberties. For people of faith, love of God and country is a virtue when grounded in gratitude and service. We honor our nation not by claiming it's perfect, but by working to make it better. We pray for our leaders, support our communities, care for our neighbors, and contribute to the common good. In doing so, we help our nation live up to its highest ideals as one nation under God.

Respecting the flag is an act of gratitude; disrespecting it is a failure to appreciate what it truly represents. When someone deliberately disrespects the flag, it's worth asking: what exactly are they disrespecting? Generations of Americans have fought, suffered, and even died while carrying this symbol into battle. Families have folded it with tears at military funerals. Immigrants have looked upon it as a sign of hope and opportunity. For many, it represents dreams fulfilled and freedoms preserved. Our respect for the flag doesn't require believing that America is perfect; no nation is perfect. Rather, it means recognizing that our country is worth loving, worth improving, and worth preserving. The flag reminds us of our highest ideals and challenges us to live up to them.

As we celebrate Flag Day, may we look upon our flag with renewed appreciation. May it remind us of the sacrifices of the past, the responsibilities of the present, and the hopes of the future. And may we never forget that the true glory of the American flag lies not merely in its colors and design, but in the enduring principles of liberty, justice, equality, and unity that it represents. God bless our nation, those who serve it, and all who strive to make it a beacon of freedom and hope for generations to come!
