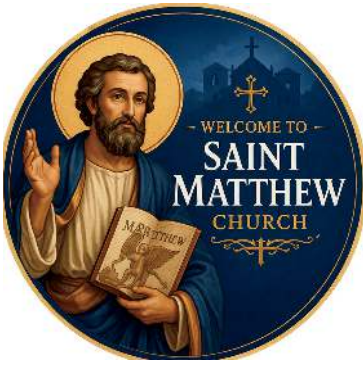

When the woman had been called and stood at the door, Elisha promised, "This time next year you will be fondling a baby son."

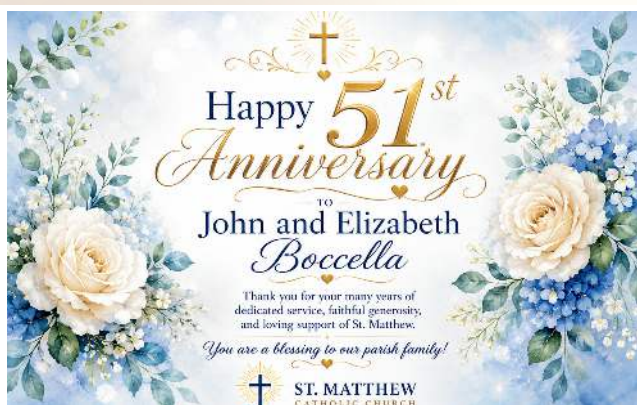
Reading II

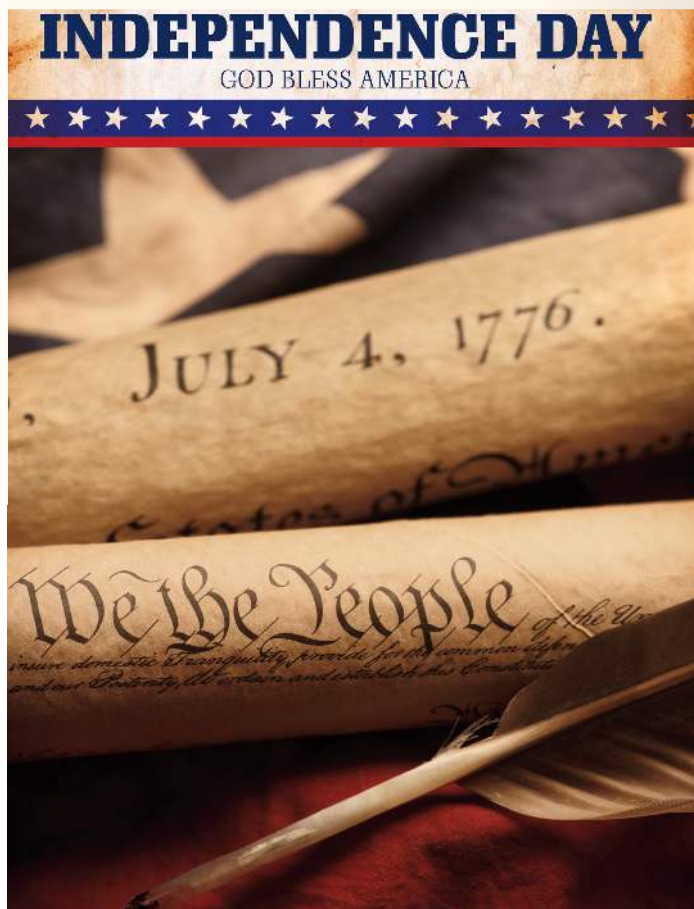


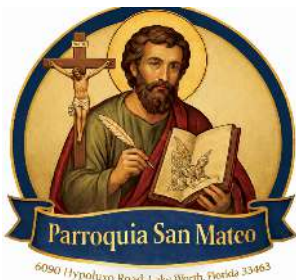

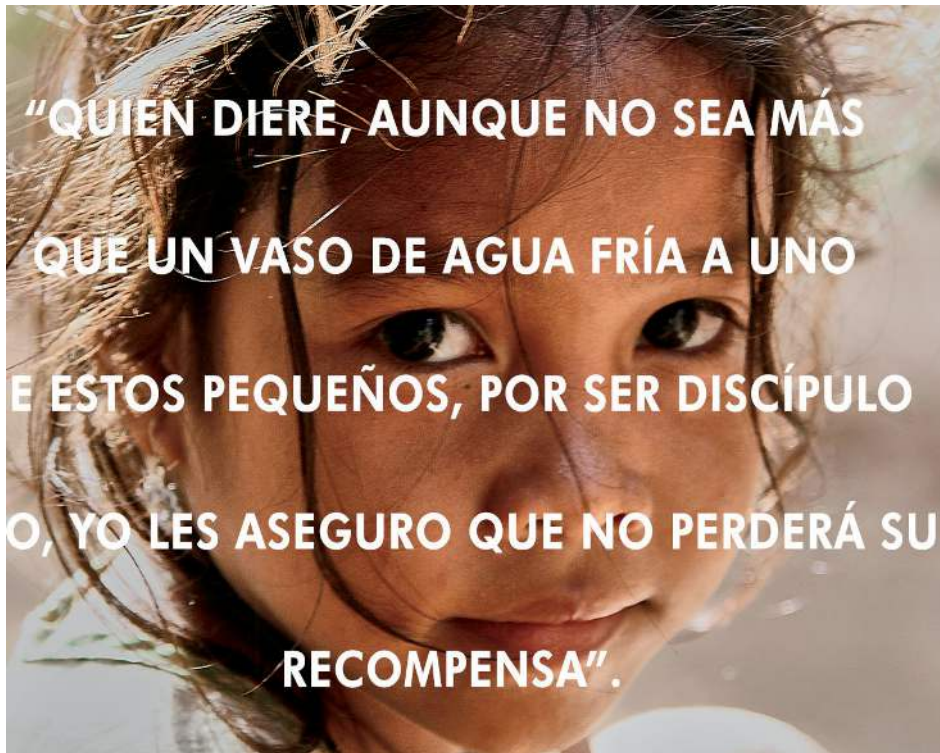

Pope: Technology should serve friendships, not replace them

During a visit to the Vatican's summer camp for children of employees, Pope Leo XIV encouraged children to use technology responsibly.

Pope Leo XIV visited the Vatican's Estate Ragazzi summer camp on Monday, meeting with children and young people taking part in this year's program and answering several questions. The theme is focused on Jules Verne's "Around the World in 80 Days."

Human relationships come first Responding to a question about the difficulty of disconnecting from screens during the school year, Pope Leo acknowledged the benefits of technology but stressed that it should not take the place of real human interaction. "Technology can be very good and very useful for many things," he said. "However, when we are together, it is not necessary to have a mobile phone, smartphone, or tablet in our hands at every moment."

The Pope encouraged the children to spend time together as people rather than through devices.

"It is very important to build friendships, to spend time together, to play together, and perhaps even to study together," he said. "We are human beings, persons, and contact with others is extremely important."

He extended the reflection to family life, noting that "when a family is together, it is not enough for everyone to sit there looking at their own phone," he said. "It is very important to learn how to talk, to have conversations, and to enjoy one another's company."

The Pope also highlighted the importance of prayer, reminding the children that "even if we can have the Bible and prayers on our phones, God does not want to look at our phones," adding that "God wants to look at our hearts and at our lives."

Recognising digital dependence Speaking particularly to the older children, Pope Leo warned that many applications are deliberately designed to keep users engaged for long periods of time.

"They try to make us dependent on this technology," he said. He suggested setting practical limits on screen use, such as putting phones away at certain times of the day and making space for conversation and family activities.

"We are not all plugged into a cable," he noted. "We are human beings."

The Pope then encouraged the children to develop both their human and spiritual lives by cultivating relationships, seeking God in prayer, and avoiding forms of dependence that can limit their freedom.

Learning to think for ourselves

Another young participant then asked the Pope about his experiences traveling around the world.

Drawing on his own travels, Pope Leo recalled several occasions when GPS navigation systems led him in the wrong direction. "In Italy, in other European countries, in Peru, and once even in the United States, I followed the GPS, and it took me down the wrong road," he said.

The Pope explained that "it is much better to learn to think for ourselves and to develop the critical ability to know where we are going in life."

He then encouraged the children to make full use of the abilities God has given them rather than relying entirely on technology.

"I do not need my phone if my brain is working," he said, adding that preparation and good judgment help people navigate difficulties and find solutions when unexpected problems arise. Prayer with the Pope At the end of the encounter, Pope Leo XIV was named "Chief Explorer" of the summer camp and was presented with an explorer's kit and a commemorative plaque. He invited the children to pray with him and encouraged them to tell their parents that they had prayed together with the Pope. "Prayer is very important for us," he concluded. "We want Jesus to be here with us."

Msgr. Tom's Musings: (part 2) AND WHAT DO WE CATHOLICS TAKE PRIDE

(This is a continuation of Archbishop Lori's homily from last week)

[To consecrate ourselves to the Sacred Heart is ultimately to accept Jesus' invitation to remain in His love, and to allow that love to shape every aspect of our lives, public and private. Jesus tells us, "This is my commandment: love one another as I love you." To love as Christ loves is the true measure of Christian discipleship, and it is the true measure of our humanity. Yet, if we are honest, we must acknowledge that neither our nation nor the Church has always reflected that love. Indeed, it is sometimes obscured almost beyond recognition. To be sure, there have been moments of extraordinary witness and holiness, but there have also been moments of failure, division, and sin. Consecration requires the humility to acknowledge both. We cannot come to the heart of Christ while pretending we have no need of His mercy.

To consecrate ourselves and our nation is to place our wounds, our shortcomings, and our sins through the one whose love is greater than them all. Jesus says, "It was not you who chose me, but I who chose you, and appointed you to go and bear fruit that will last." Those words describe the Church's mission throughout our nation's history. Catholics have contributed immeasurably to the life of this country through faith, sacrifice, education, charity, and service. We give God thanks and praise for that legacy and commend to His love—the love of His heart—those who have gone before us in faith.

Yet consecration is not merely about remembering the past. It is about accepting responsibility for the future. To consecrate ourselves to the Sacred Heart means remaining in Christ's love and carrying that love out into the world. It means building communities, ecclesial and civil, where the truth is proclaimed clearly and charity is practiced generously. It means resisting the temptation to define ourselves by division, ideology, or resentment. The Sacred Heart does not divide; it reconciles. It does not harden hearts; it transforms them. It does not simply invite us to receive love; it sends us forth to share it.

This consecration is something we do together. The renewal of the Church and the renewal of our nation will not come through declarations alone. It will come through disciples who remain in Christ's love and bear the good fruit of holiness in families, parishes, communities, and in their day-to-day lives.

As we approach this great anniversary of our nation, we may be tempted towards nostalgia for the past or anxiety about the future. Today, we choose something better: Trust. Today we place the Church of the United States, and these United States of America, into the Sacred Heart of Jesus—not because we have figured everything out, but because we know the One whose love endures forever. In this Heart we will find gratitude for the past, strength for the present, and hope for the future.]

[Msgr.]: I do hope we take pride in the fact that we are "one nation under God," and are now consecrated to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. If we truly dedicate ourselves to God and his command over us, may we show it by the way we live our lives. Thank you, Archbishops and Bishops.

Saint Junípero Serra, Priest July 1

Saint Junípero Serra (1713–1784) was a Spanish Franciscan priest and missionary who dedicated his life to bringing the Gospel to the people of what is now California. Leaving behind a comfortable life as a professor, he traveled to the New World to proclaim Christ and serve those in need. Despite many hardships, including illness and long journeys on foot, Father Serra founded nine missions and helped establish the Catholic faith throughout California. Known for his deep love of God, devotion to prayer, and missionary zeal, Saint Junípero Serra remains a model of courage, sacrifice, and evangelization. He was canonized by Pope Francis in 2015 and is honored as one of the great missionary saints of the United States.

Cultivating Vocations in Our Parish
Every vocation to the priesthood, diaconate, or religious life begins with God's call and is nurtured within a community of faith. A parish can play a vital role in fostering vocations by praying regularly for vocations, encouraging young people to listen to God's call, and supporting seminarians, priests, deacons, and religious through friendship and prayer. Families are often called the "first seminary," where children learn to love God and serve others. When parents, grandparents, catechists, and parishioners speak positively about vocations and provide opportunities for young people to grow in faith, they help create an environment where God's call can be heard. Simple efforts such as Eucharistic Adoration, vocation awareness events, holy hours, visits from seminarians and religious, and participation in organizations such as the Serra Club can inspire future generations to consider a life of service to Christ and His Church. Let us pray that many hearts in our parish will respond generously to the Lord's invitation: "Follow me."
