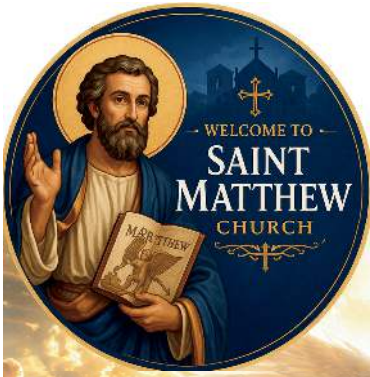

SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

FIRST READING WISDOM 12:13, 16-19

There is no god besides you who have the care of all, that you need show you have not unjustly condemned. For your might is the source of justice; your mastery over all things makes you lenient to all. For you show your might when the perfection of your power is disbelieved; and in those who know you, you rebuke temerity. But though you are master of might, you judge with clemency, and with much lenience you govern us; for power, whenever you will, attends you. And you taught your people, by these deeds, that those who are just must be kind; and you gave your children good ground for hope that you would permit repentance for their sins.

GOSPEL - MATTHEW 13:24-43

Jesus proposed another parable to the crowds, saying: "The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a man who sowed good seed in his field. While everyone was asleep his enemy came and sowed weeds all through the wheat, and then went off. When the crop grew and bore fruit, the weeds appeared as well. The slaves of the householder came to him and said, 'Master, did you not sow good seed in your field? Where have the weeds come from?' He answered, 'An enemy has done this.' His slaves said to him, 'Do you want us to go and pull them up?' He replied, 'No, if you pull up the weeds you might uproot the wheat along with them. Let them grow together until harvest; then at harvest time I will say to the harvesters, "First collect the weeds and tie them in bundles for burning; but gather the wheat into my barn."'" He proposed another parable to them. "The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed that a person took and sowed in a field. It is the smallest of all the seeds, yet when full-grown it is the largest of plants. It becomes a large bush, and the birds of the sky come and dwell in its branches." He spoke to them another parable. "The kingdom of heaven is like yeast that a woman took and mixed with three measures of wheat flour until the whole batch was leavened." All these things Jesus spoke to the crowds in parables. He spoke to them only in parables, to fulfill what had been said through the prophet: I will open my mouth in parables, I will announce what has lain hidden from the foundation of the world. Then, dismissing the crowds, he went into the house. His disciples approached him and said, "Explain to us the parable of the weeds in the field." He said in reply, "He who sows good seed is the Son of Man, the field is the world, the good seed the children of the kingdom. The weeds are the children of the evil one, and the enemy who sows them is the devil. The harvest is the end of the age, and the harvesters are angels. Just as weeds are collected and burned up with fire, so will it be at the end of the age. The Son of Man will send his angels, and they will collect out of his kingdom all who cause others to sin and all evildoers. They will throw them into the fiery furnace, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth. Then the righteous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father. Whoever has ears ought to hear."

THE ROLE OF THE HOLY SPIRIT IN THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

In the Catholic Church, the Holy Spirit is the Third Person of the Holy Trinity, together with the Father and the Son. He is the soul of the Church, guiding, sanctifying, and strengthening her. Without the Holy Spirit, the Church could not fulfill the mission Christ entrusted to her.

1. He Gives Life to the Church

The Holy Spirit descended upon the Apostles at Pentecost, marking the beginning of the Church's mission (Acts 2). Since then, He has remained with the Church until the end of time.

2. He Sanctifies the Faithful

The Holy Spirit helps us grow in holiness by transforming our hearts so that we may live as true disciples of Christ.

"Be holy, because I am holy."

(1 Peter 1:16)

3. He Works Through the Sacraments

Every sacrament is an action of Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit.

In Baptism, He makes us children of God.

In Confirmation, He strengthens us with His gifts.

In the Holy Eucharist, He transforms the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ.

In the Sacrament of Reconciliation, He brings God's forgiveness.

Through all the sacraments, He continues to pour God's grace into our lives.

4. He Teaches and Guides the Church

Jesus promised:

"The Holy Spirit... will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you."

(John 14:26)

For this reason, the Holy Spirit guides the Pope, the bishops, and the entire Church in faithfully preserving the truth of the Gospel.

5. He Helps Us Pray

Many times we do not know how to pray as we should. The Holy Spirit prays within us.

"The Spirit comes to the aid of our weakness... the Spirit himself intercedes for us with inexpressible groanings."

(Romans 8:26-27)

6. He Bestows His Seven Gifts

In a special way through the Sacrament of Confirmation, the Holy Spirit gives us His seven gifts:

Wisdom /Understanding/Counsel/Fortitude/Knowledge/Piety/Fear of the Lord

These gifts help us live as faithful sons and daughters of God.

7. He Produces Fruits in Our Lives

When we allow the Holy Spirit to work within us, His fruits become evident:

Love/Joy/Peace/Patience/Kindness/Goodness/Faithfulness/Gentleness

Self-control

(Galatians 5:22-23)

8. He Gives Us Strength to Evangelize

Just as He strengthened the Apostles to proclaim Christ without fear, the Holy Spirit gives us the courage to witness to the Gospel in our families, workplaces, and communities.

In Summary

The Holy Spirit:

- ✧ Gives life to the Church.
- ✧ Sanctifies the faithful.
- ✧ Works through the sacraments.
- ✧ Teaches and guides the Church in truth.
- ✧ Helps us pray.
- ✧ Bestows His gifts and bears fruit in our lives.
- ✧ Strengthens us to proclaim Christ.
- ✧ Leads us to eternal life.

As the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC 737) teaches:

"The mission of Christ and of the Holy Spirit is brought to completion in the Church, which is the Body of Christ and the Temple of the Holy Spirit. This joint mission henceforth brings Christ's faithful to share in His communion with the Father in the Holy Spirit."

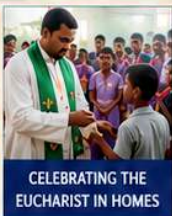

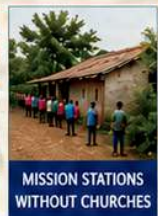

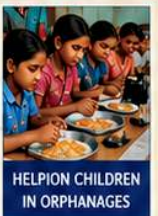

Msgr. Tom's musings: PRAY FOR TRUE UNITY IN THE CHURCH

Recently, our new Bishop Manuel de Jesus Rodriguez, issued a pastoral decree (a very strong statement), as did many of his fellow American Catholic bishops, concerning Pope Leo's recent excommunication of an organization (The Priestly Fraternity of Saint Pius X, or SSPX) that claims to be the authentic teacher of the Catholic Church, in defiance of the recognized teachings of our Church under the supreme authority of the Pope. This division within our Church is not the result of some recent falling out, but has been part of an ongoing struggle since the days of Vatican Council II in the 1960s. I'll try to explain, in these next 2 issues of my weekly musings, the scope and impact of all these actions.

[Part 1] This past July 2nd, the Vatican declared that the six Society of Saint Pius X (SSPX) bishops involved in carrying out illicit episcopal (bishop) ordinations that week have incurred excommunication, and that all of the society's clergy members, as well as any lay faithful who formally adhere to the SSPX, are in schism and are excommunicated. [Schism is a split in the Church when a group or movement separates itself from the main body, usually because of doctrinal differences. It differs from a heresy in that a heresy is the denial of a one or more specific doctrinal teachings of the Church.]

The Vatican issued the formal decree stating that the six excommunicated SSPX bishops incurred "ipso facto" (automatic) the 'latae sententiae' excommunication (whose lifting of the penalty is reserved to the Holy See alone) for having carried out 'an act of a schismatic nature' -- the episcopal consecration of four priests, without a papal mandate and against the will of the Supreme Pontiff. The Vatican also declared that the Sacraments of Penance and Matrimony administered by SSPX clergy are invalid. The SSPX episcopal consecrations took place July 1 in Switzerland, at the headquarters of that Society, despite repeated warnings from the Vatican that the act would be schismatic. On June 28, Pope Leo XIV had personally pleaded with the society to turn back from its plan and consider a path of dialogue with the Church. From the time of Pope Saint Paul VI up to the most recent talks held recently at the Vatican, the many attempts to bring the members of the movement begun by Archbishop Marcel Lefebvre back into full communion with the Catholic Church have proved to be in vain. This situation is in open violation of the Church's Canon law. For those who remember, Pope St. John Paul II also did the same in 1988, after SSPX founder, Archbishop Lefebvre, illicitly consecrated four bishops in a disobedience that implied the rejection of the Pope's primacy. They, too, were excommunicated. In 2009, Pope Benedict XVI offered an interpretation of the purpose of excommunication, noting its goal is actually to bring about unity amid the danger of a schism. He stated that "The Church must react by employing her most severe punishment – excommunication – with the aim of calling those thus punished to repent and to return to unity." In a gesture of good will, Pope Benedict XVI lifted that excommunication in the hopes that those recalcitrant bishops would make their way back into unity with the Catholic Church under the Pope. That didn't really happen. As another sign of Goodwill on the part of the Church, Pope Francis granted to SSPX priest in 2016 and 2017 the conditional right to validly administer those two sacraments. Now, however, the latest decree indicates that the sacrament of Penance administered by them, and marriages assisted by them are invalid. Pope Leo had specifically warned in his June 28 letter to the SSPX that carrying out the consecrations would impact the faithful's access to licit, and in certain cases valid, reception of the sacraments through the SSPX. He had implored them to consider the spiritual good of the faithful before going through with the consecration. I will continue my thoughts next week. [End of part 1]
