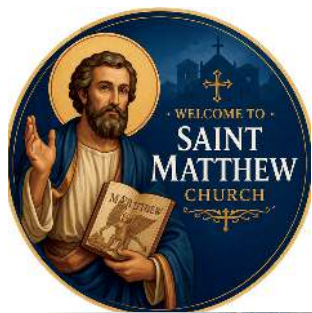

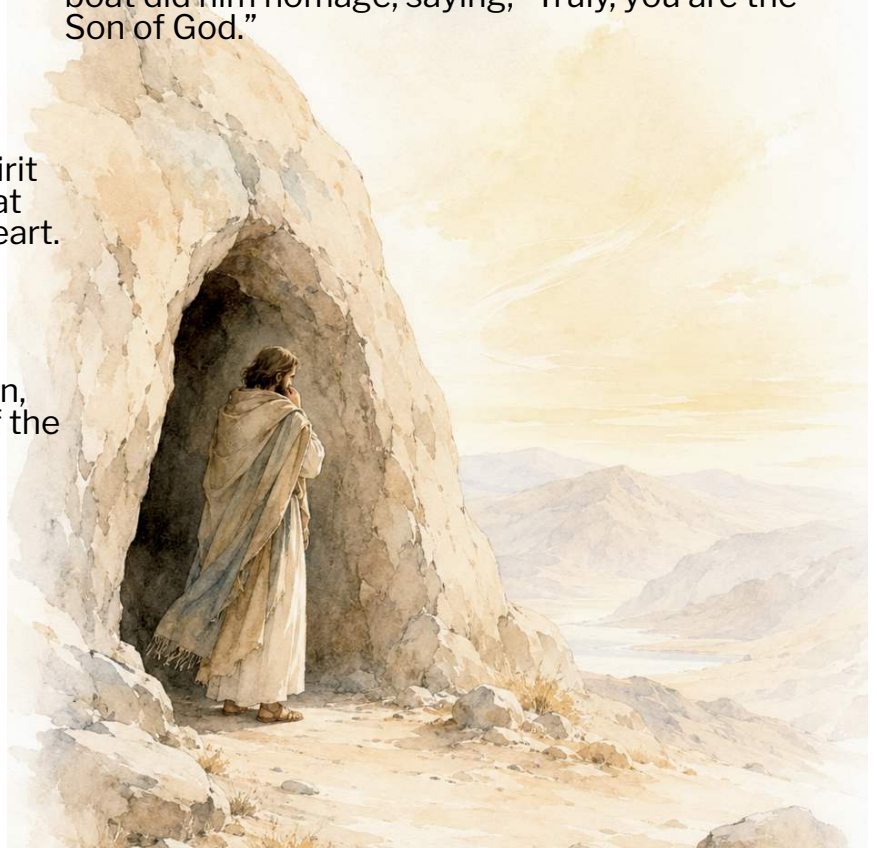

Msgr. Tom's Musings: A Totally Different World Less Than 3 Hours Away

It's so good to be back in the U.S.A. after a nine-day sojourn in Guatemala. Our mission with the Knights Of Columbus was definitely a success, and I thank you for your prayers because, I believe, they helped us in many ways. Each day was sunny and hot, though it rained heavily almost every evening when we were in the safety of our hotel on the edge of the jungle. There were 14 of us from all over Florida on the trip, including your two favorite altar servers from St. Matthew's, the Miller Twins, Dylan and Jacob. There were 14 men and teens among us, and each pitched in very well with the work projects that were assigned. These varied from digging the foundations for a latrine to sanding, vanishing and building picnic-like table and bench combinations - not easy tasks. We arrived on a Saturday morning and began to get accustomed to our new surroundings. We stayed that first night in a hotel in Guatemala City, and celebrated the anticipated Sunday Mass that first evening. On Sunday morning, we boarded our van to take the 20-minute ride to the central bus terminal. There, as we waited for our bus, we prayed the rosary together, giving witness to our calling as Catholic men of faith. The six-hour bus trip included a half-hour rest stop where we grabbed some snacks. When we arrived at Puerto Barrios, we loaded ourselves and our luggage into three taxis for a seven block trip to the boat dock. There we boarded a school-owned motor launch for a half-hour high speed ride along the Caribbean coast of Guatemala. disembarking from the boat, we had to lug our bags up 69 steps into the hotel, where we were staying. It wasn't a luxurious spa, but it was clean and provided us with air-conditioned rooms (I would call it a Guatemalan equivalent of a Motel 6). Each evening, we would walk about 5 blocks to a restaurant called Buga Mama, owned and operated by the students of the Father Tom Moran School, which was our daily destination by boat from the hotel. That 30-minute ride through a gorgeously forested canyon of unparalleled beauty gave us our daily opportunity for praying the rosary. On Monday, when our boat pulled up to the dock at the school, over 150 students were there to greet us. That was a fantastic experience for those who had never been there, for the students had learned our names ahead of time, and many of them carried handmade signs with our individual names, welcoming us. From there, most of the men marched a third of a mile uphill through the jungle to their workplace, while I stayed below and taught a dozen children some practical English expressions useful upon their graduation, when they'd be employed in hotels and restaurants in the large cities. Lunch was served each day in a "restaurant" run by the students on the floor above my classroom, which similarly was an opened area under a roof covering. Though the meals were the same each day, they were nutritious and tasty. Part of the curriculum of the school is to prepare these students to be good cooks, waiters, managers and leaders.

At the end of each working day, we would enjoy the fast ride back through the canyon and cool down our sweated bodies in the welcome breeze. The average temperature this past week was about 8° cooler than you were enduring in Florida. After showering, we'd head to Buga Mama for dinner, then return to our hotel and enjoy a game of cards called "Golf" (aka "Beat Monsignor Tom."). Though it rained heavily nearly each evening, every morning was beautiful and sunny, as we began the day with Morning Prayer (the official prayer of the Catholic Church), a good breakfast at the hotel, and then our journey down the 69 steps to the boat dock, continuing our daily routine.

Each day's celebration of Mass would depend upon our circumstances. Two afternoons before we went to dinner, we had Mass on the porch of the hotel, an idyllic setting overlooking the Caribbean. On Wednesday, we celebrated Mass at the school in a large, open air hall. Over 350 students attended, and a lovely choir that rehearsed for a week sang the hymns in the native language, Qeqchi. All of the students were dressed in their best clothes, neat and modest, with girls wearing long skirts and the boys wearing long pants. Despite the heat and humidity, none of the students or teachers wore shorts! On Thursday, after a full workday, we journeyed up river through a little bit of paradise, to a very Catholic village and celebrated Mass in the community center, which also served as their Chapel. Though I celebrated and preached in Spanish, the readings and hymns were done in Qeqchi, and a catechist translated the homily. Because of a shortage of priests, they rarely have Mass, but a catechist conducts a weekly service and distributes Holy Communion obtained from the parish church in Livingston, as needed. For them, this occasion was like Christmas, and our men and teens distributed hard candy to the children after Mass, when we posed for a group picture with the villagers outside the Chapel.

All of these wonderful experiences lifted the spirits of the men, and they will surely treasure it in their hearts and minds for a long time to come. I thank you for your prayers and support of our mission work, and pray that we can continue to do this for years to come, possibly with more Knights from our parish joining us.

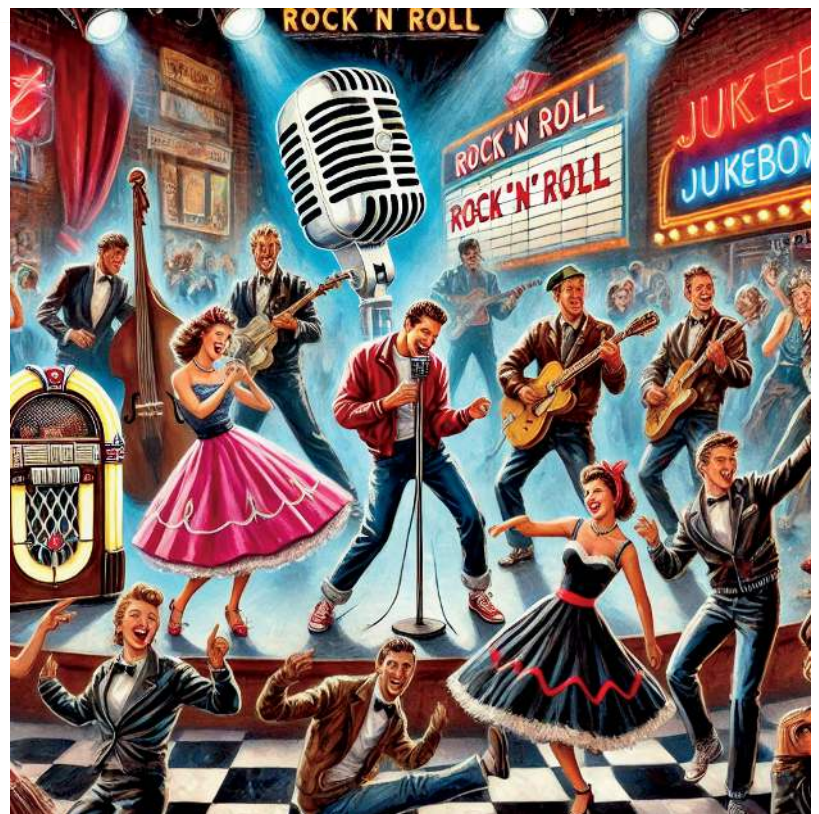

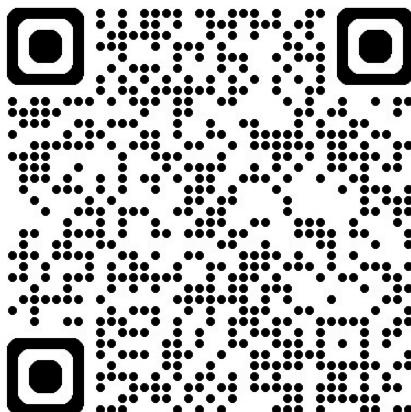
