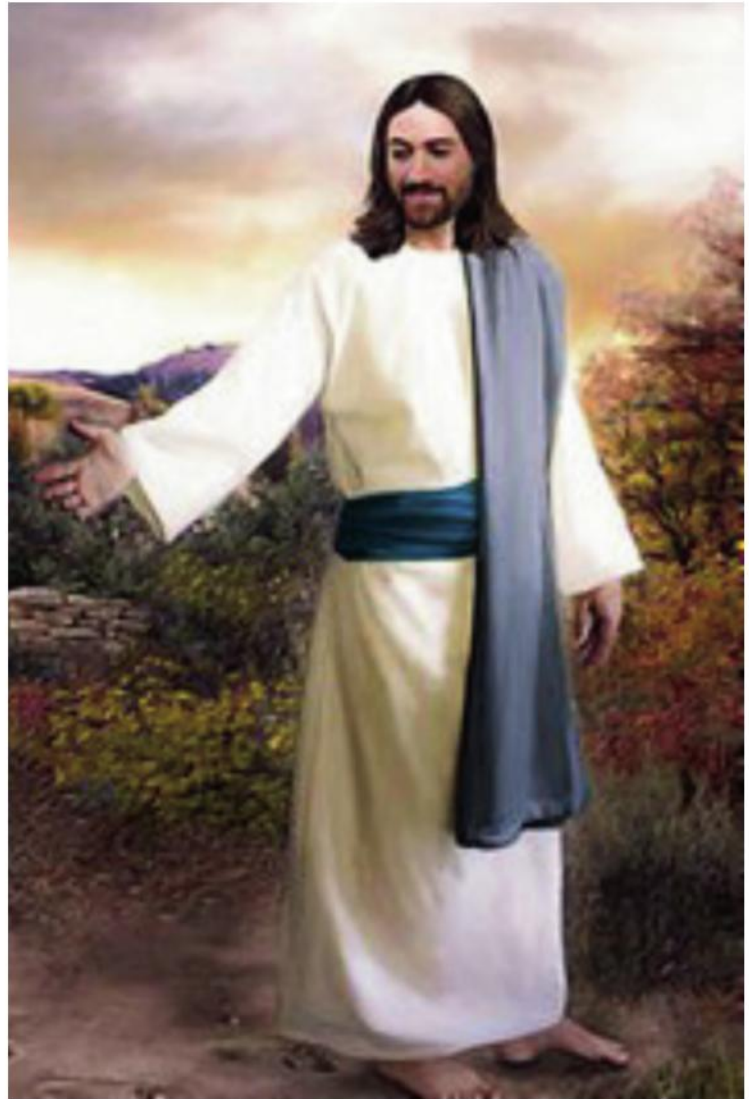

Lectionary: 78

Reading I

Jeremiah 17:5-8

Thus says the LORD:

Cursed is the one who trusts in human beings, who seeks his strength in flesh, whose heart turns away from the LORD. He is like a barren bush in the desert that enjoys no change of season, but stands in a lava waste, a salt and empty earth. Blessed is the one who trusts in the LORD, whose hope is the LORD.

He is like a tree planted beside the waters that stretches out its roots to the stream: it fears not the heat when it comes; its leaves stay green; in the year of drought it shows no distress, but still bears fruit.

Reading II

1 Corinthians 15:12, 16-20

Brothers and sisters:

If Christ is preached as raised from the dead, how can some among you say there is no resurrection of the dead? If the dead are not raised, neither has Christ been raised, and if Christ has not been raised, your faith is vain; you are still in your sins. Then those who have fallen asleep in Christ have perished. If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are the most pitiable people of all. But now Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep.

Gospel

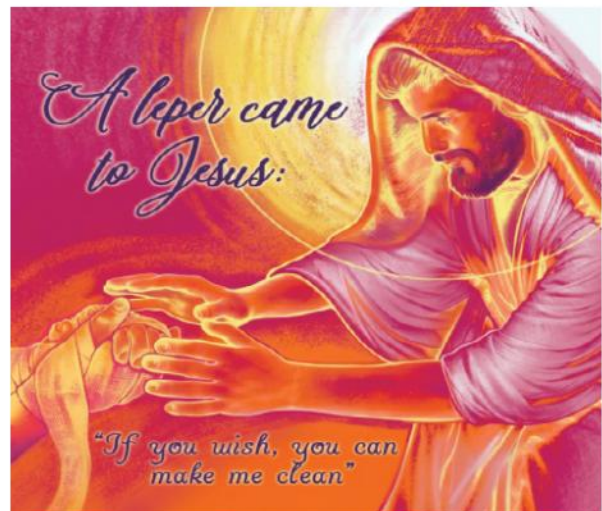
Luke 6:17, 20-26

Jesus came down with the Twelve and stood on a stretch of level ground with a great crowd of his disciples and a large number of the people from all Judea and Jerusalem and the coastal region of Tyre and Sidon.

And raising his eyes toward his disciples he said:

“Blessed are you who are poor, for the kingdom of God is yours. Blessed are you who are now hungry, for you will be satisfied. Blessed are you who are now weeping, for you will laugh. Blessed are you when people hate you, and when they exclude and insult you, and denounce your name as evil on account of the Son of Man.

Rejoice and leap for joy on that day! Behold, your reward will be great in heaven. For their ancestors treated the prophets in the same way. But woe to you who are rich, for you have received your consolation. Woe to you who are filled now, for you will be hungry. Woe to you who laugh now, for you will grieve and weep. Woe to you when all speak well of you, for their ancestors treated the false prophets in this way.”



REFLECTION

In Luke's version of the Beatitudes, he has only four blessings and he adds four woes. Did you notice that all the things that we work forty or more hours a week to give to our family are considered “woes”? So is Jesus saying we should not have savings for the future, food for the kids, a happy, safe environment, or a good reputation?

I suspect that the disciples and the others listening to Jesus wondered the same thing. The values of this world are not necessarily the values of God's Kingdom. Jesus himself is the extreme example of reversing worldly values: His death was not a tragic ending, but the saving action that brought us forgiveness and new life in the Resurrection.

So how do we experience the blessings of the poor, the hungry, the mourning, or the unpopular? Do we have the faith to let go of self-reliance and to trust in Jesus? How much money does it take to meet the needs of our family? Are we really helping our children if we give them anything they want? We buy them nice clothing; do we teach them to see Jesus in others? How can we say this is all too idealistic, and still claim to believe in the Resurrection?

I don't expect everyone to go around saying “woe is me.” Some of the happiest people are those who live simple lives of faith and trust in God. When we learn to trust the Lord and love one another, we not only can see Jesus in the poor or the lonely, he can also be seen in us.

Sexto domingo ordinario

(Jeremías 17, 5-8; Salmo 1; 1 Corintios 15, 12. 16-20; Lucas 6, 17. 20-26)

“Antes nunca estuve así enamorado. No sentí jamás esta sensación. La gente en las calles parece más buena. Todo es diferente, gracias al amor. La felicidad, ¡ja, ja, ja, ja! De sentir amo-o-o-or...”, grabó Palito Ortega en 1967. La canción se convirtió en un súper éxito para el cantante argentino, quien tomó por inspiración la relación con su esposa Evangelina, con quien se había casado ese mismo año.

Las escrituras presentadas por la liturgia de hoy ofrecen una “receta para la felicidad” que quizás no diste de lo que el Sr. Ortega quiso resaltar en su composición musical. La selección del libro del profeta Jeremías y el Salmo 1 apuntan a que la fuente de esa verdadera dicha es confiar en el SEÑOR y poner la esperanza en Él, amando su ley y cumpliendo sus mandamientos. Se destaca que los que siguen esta manera de vivir son “como un árbol plantado junto al río, que da fruto a su tiempo y nunca se marchita” (cf. Sal 1,3).

Las instrucciones del “sermón de la llanura” dentro del Evangelio de San Lucas, por su parte, sorprenden por la paradoja de que sean llamados bienaventurados *los pobres, los hambrientos, los que lloran, los que son rechazados* por causa de Cristo. Esto se contrapone a la autosuficiencia de *los ricos*, pues al percibir que lo tienen todo no sienten necesidad de vivir de acuerdo a los preceptos de Dios.

En palabras de SS. Papa Francisco, “las bienaventuranzas nacen del corazón compasivo de Jesús que se encuentra con el corazón compasivo y necesitado de compasión de hombres y mujeres que quieren y anhelan una vida bendecida; de hombres y mujeres que saben de sufrimiento; que conocen desconcierto y dolor. Jesús, al proclamar las bienaventuranzas viene a sacudir esa *postración negativa* llamada resignación que nos hace creer que se puede vivir mejor si nos escapamos de los problemas, si huimos de los demás; si nos escondemos o encerramos en nuestras comodidades, si nos adormecemos en un consumismo tranquilizante. Esa resignación que nos lleva a aislarnos de todos, a dividirnos, separarnos; a hacernos ciegos frente a la vida y al sufrimiento de los otros. Encomendémonos a la Virgen, y que ella nos ayude a vivir y a desear el espíritu de las bienaventuranzas.”

Before going to Confession, do an examination of conscience to reflect on what sins you have committed. Say a prayer to the Holy Spirit for guidance. If you are worried you won't remember your sins, it's OK to make a written list and bring it with you to Confession. It is important that you are truly sorry for your sins (contrition) and that you are determined to try and avoid committing these sins in the future (resolution).

STEP 1: PREPARE FOR CONFESSION

When you enter the confessional, you can choose to kneel behind the screen and confess anonymously or to walk over and sit in the chair across from Father to confess face-to-face. **BEGIN WITH THE SIGN OF THE CROSS:** In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **CONFESS YOUR SINS:** * Begin by saying, "Bless me, Father, for I have sinned. It has been (# of weeks/months/ years) since my last confession. These are my sins." If you are not doing a face-to-face confession, it can be helpful to the priest to say your age, marital status, or other important characteristics. • Next, tell the priest all of the sins you have committed and if possible indicate the number or frequency of the sin. Is this something you do often or was it just once? • When you have said all your sins, end with, "For these and all my sins, I am truly sorry." **LISTEN TO THE PRIEST:** • Listen closely as the priest talks to you and gives you your penance. • The priest will ask you to pray an Act of Contrition out loud. • When you finish, the priest will extend his hand and say the prayer of absolution: *God, the Father of mercies, through the death and resurrection of his Son has reconciled the world to himself and sent the Holy Spirit among us for the forgiveness of sins; through the ministry of the Church may God give you pardon and peace, and I absolve you from your sins in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.* You reply, "Amen." • Lastly, the priest will dismiss you with a prayer, such as: The Lord has freed you from your sins. Go in peace. You respond, "Thanks be to God" and leave the confessional. After leaving the confessional, go into a pew, kneel down and say a prayer of thanksgiving to God for his mercy and love. If the penance given by the priest is to say certain prayers, complete your penance in the church. If your penance is something else, such as making amends with a person, try to complete this as soon as you can.

STEP 2: COMPLETE YOUR PENANCE

ACT OF CONTRITION

There are many different versions of the Act of Contrition. Choose one of the following to say in Confession. A copy of the prayer is also posted in the Confessional.

O my God, I am heartily sorry for having offended you, and I detest all my sins because of your just punishments. But most of all because I have offended you, My God, who are all good and deserving of all my love. I firmly resolve, with the help of your grace, to sin no more and to avoid the near occasions of sin. Amen.

or My God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart. In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good, I have sinned against you whom I should love above all things. I firmly intend, with your help, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid whatever leads me to sin. Our Savior Jesus Christ suffered and died for us. In his name, my God, have mercy. Amen.

or O my God, I am heartily sorry for having offended Thee, and I detest all my sins, because I dread the loss of heaven, and the pains of hell; but most of all because they offend Thee, my God, Who are all good and deserving of all my love.
